## Travel to/through the United States from international locations

Beginning January 25, the U.S. Centers of Disease Control (CDC) will require all travelers flying to or transiting through the U.S. from international destinations, including U.S. citizens, to provide proof of either a negative COVID-19 test or documentation of recovery. See [U.S. requirements](#)

### Travel waiver for existing reservations with international travel to/connecting through the U.S. that meet the following criteria

- Original travel dates January 13, 2021 – February 15, 2021.
- The change fee and any difference in fare will be waived for new United flights departing on or before January 25, 2021.
- Travel must be rescheduled in the originally ticketed cabin and between the same cities as originally ticketed.
- Travel agents: Add waiver code OSI UA 7JCPB
