



What to expect during the England lockdown

On 31 October, England announced a second lockdown for the period of 05 November to 02 December 2020.

What this means is that:

- All non-essential shops will close, along with restaurants, bars, cafes, hair salons, cinemas, theatres, concert halls, nightclubs and most leisure centers.
- Schools, colleges and universities remain open.
- All restaurants across the UK will be closed for dine-in however, restaurants are permitted to deliver takeaway food.
- Businesses and venues are permitted to stay open, following COVID-19 secure guidelines. This includes those providing essential goods, including:
 - Essential retail such as food shops, supermarkets, pharmacies, garden centers, hardware stores and building merchants.
 - Petrol Stations, car repairs, bicycle shops, and taxi and vehicle hire businesses.
 - Banks, building societies, post offices, short-term loan providers and money transfer businesses
 - Medical and dental services
 - Car parks, public toilets and motorway service areas.
 - Outdoor playgrounds. People can sit on park benches and have picnics as long as it is with their household.
 - Hotels and hostels will remain open for people travelling for work and limited other reasons.
 - People can travel to buy goods or services from premises that are open, including essential retail.
