



## THE PEARL OF THE INDIAN OCEAN

Reunion is 9,180 km away from Paris, in the Mascarene Islands, at the heart of the Indian Ocean, formerly known as the "Eastern Ocean".

Along with Mayotte, it is the only French department in the southern hemisphere, and is a neighbouring island of Mauritius, Rodrigues and Madagascar. Reunion is one of the esteemed islands that make up the superb tourist destination known as the "Vanilla Islands", along with Mauritius, Madagascar, the Seychelles, the Comoro Islands and Mayotte!

In 2020, Reunion also received the "Best Nature Destination" in the Indian Ocean" Award at the 27th World Travel Awards.



## "LONTAN" REUNION\*: THE GOOD LIFE

Reunion has evolved over the years, but its identity remains strong. Some have retained the former way of life, the games, the Lontan cuisine but also the patois (local dialect), the way the "gramounes" (elderly) chat. See for yourself the heritage of yesteryear: the Chinese shops, the "Zarabe" shops, the traditional "courant d'air" buses, picnics, fishing, the ox wagon, Creole huts, corn mills, the coffee grinder and the "grègue" (teapot), the "caro" (iron), the washing rock and much, much more.

In 1793, Ile Bourbon became Reunion, in tribute to the coming together (reunion) of volunteers from Marseille and the battalions of the National Guard - known as the soldiers of Year II - during the assault on the Palais des Tuileries, the previous year. It was this uprising that led to the end of the constitutional monarchy in France.

## SETTLEMENT ON REUNION ISLAND

Reunion Island was unclaimed territory when settlement began in the middle of the 17th century. The first settlers, the French, were soon joined by a few Europeans, sailors or craftsmen, and the first slaves were sent over as and when labour was needed. Reunion Island was created through successive waves of immigration.. It is home to an exceptional population, and is a reference in terms of diversity, with locals who originally came from Madagascar, East Africa, South-East India and the West Indies, South China and Europe.

Reunion has a population of 859,959 (as of 1 January 2020 according to INSEE).





## CONTEMPLATE THE MILKY WAY

Why not treat yourselves to a unique experience of a night under the stars on Reunion Island? The highlands of the island are an ideal vantage point to admire the wonders of the southern sky. At two thousand metres above sea level, far from the hustle and bustle of the city, in the great silence of nature, slip into a sleeping bag and just lie back and enjoy the spectacle. Your mind will wander under the dazzling sky and get lost in the long, bright trail of the Milky Way.



## **ESCAPE TO THE HEART OF** THE PRIMARY FOREST\*

At 1,300 metres above sea level, you will come across the most magical tropical forest: Bélouve.


Before starting the trail, you can enjoy the incredible panoramic view of the Cirque of Salazie. Then, the path will gradually lead you down into the magical atmosphere of the lush forest. The sunrays reflect off the high branches and highlight the patches of mist.

In this forest there are Highland tamarinds with crooked branches, tree ferns, trunks covered in moss and wild orchids... The path leads to a breath-taking view over the "Trou de Fer" canyon and spectacular waterfalls. On the Bébour-Bélouve forest path, every step is a magical experience!

\* Primary: the primary forest on Reunion is remarkable in every way. It is particularly unique in that it has never been changed by humans (hence the name, primary).



From the Cirque de Cilaos, set out to conquer the iconic slopes of the Piton des Neiges. The path will lead you through the forest, over frost and volcanic rock. Whenever you reach a bend, you will be able to enjoy some spectacular views of the cirque. But the best is yet to come. After a good night's rest at the unmissable Caverne Dufour refuge, make sure you get up before dawn to cover the last kilometres before reaching the summit. At 3,071 metres above sea level, on the roof of the Indian Ocean, you will be faced with the most beautiful view, when the first rays of sun reflect onto the exceptional Reunion landforms with the ocean stretching off into the background, as far as the eye can see!



## EXPLORE THE LAVA TUNNELS OF AN ACTIVE VOLCANO

Do you want to experience the adventure you always dreamed of as a child? Just like Indiana Jones, set forth into the most beautiful lava tunnels, in the volcanic depths of the island! Don gloves, knee pads, helmets, headlights and shoulder harnesses, and you'll be ready for your adventure into the depths of the Earth! ## A UNESCO TREASURE

## THE TIMELESS CIRQUES\*

The three cirques on the island (Cilaos, Mafate and Salazie) are arranged in the shape of a clover around the Piton des Neiges, each rivalling the other in terms of beauty. These spectacular sites are protected by steep escarpments of rocks and greenery. A multitude of waterfalls cascade down the cliffs, which are covered with tree ferns or primary forest area.

You'll have to earn the privilege of enjoying the iconic Mafate. The area can only be accessed on foot. But, we guarantee that your efforts will be rewarded thanks to no less than ten peaks more than 2,000 metres high, 140 km of waymarked trails that wind their way between rock faces with basalt columns, and through the authentic hamlets with welcoming accommodation! In Salazie, you'll find some of the island's most beautiful waterfalls, the Piton d'Anchaing, the picturesque village of Hell-Bourg and "chouchou" fruit as far as the eye can see! Finally, do not hesitate to venture along the "road with 400 turns" to relax at the heart of the majestic Cilaos, and take advantage of the invigorating springs... Or take on the climb up the Piton des Neiges!



\*Cirque: A caldera, a large circular or elliptical depression, usually kilometres wide, often flat-bottomed, located in the heart of large volcanic formations and resulting from an eruption.

## ONE OF 34 "GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY HOTSPOTS"

Very fortunately, this is changing.

This recognition does not refer to the scorching volcano but to the island's natural riches, which are quite considerable on such a small island and are particularly threatened by human activity. When people came to settle on the island in the middle of the 17<sup>th</sup> century, they introduced, voluntarily or otherwise, several thousand exotic species from all over the world, thus disturbing the natural environment for endemic species. Many of these exotic species now pose a real threat to native flora and fauna. Humans are also responsible for other disturbances that contribute to the alteration and destruction of certain habitats and therefore endanger the island's biodiversity. The trees, the flowers and the birds are all calling out for help, but for a long time they have not been listened to...

A LUSH GARDEN

The mild temperatures mean that the whole island is like a tropical garden and more than 1,600 plant species flourish here. Over 70% of them are of Afro-Malagasy origin, and arrived naturally, brought over by birds or with the winds and marine currents. The island is also home to 237 endemic species. You'll be amazed by the 120 species of orchid that bloom in the undergrowth or forests of the Highlands and by the extraordinary Flamboyant and Frangipani trees.

No other tropical island boasts such incredible plant life. The sheer variety on the island is thanks to the many microclimates here.

The Reunion coastline and the sandy beaches are covered with resistant shrubs such as common screw pines, casuarinas and veloutiers. On the west coast, the savannah occupies a vast space and is mainly composed of grasses and thorny plants such as Sweet Acacia and Heteropogon Contortus.

The low-altitude dry forests are home to unique denizens,

which usually bear the

symbolic Creole names: drum wood, milk wood, sponge wood, coloured wood, etc. In the south-east of the island, a humid rainforest is home to the famous barbel palms and ironwood and a multitude of mosses, ferns and orchids. The cloud forests in the Highlands are the lushest and best preserved of the island, such as Bébour and Bélouve forests which are still in their primary state today. Trees such as "bois magie" or "Tan rouge" (Weinmannia tinctoria) flourish side by side and numerous tree ferns, called "fanjans", push their parasols above the canopy. At altitudes higher than 2,000 metres, the landscape becomes more mineral and the lush green forests give way to smaller vegetation with "hard leaves" and twisted shapes.

There are countless sustainable and responsible initiatives in place across the island. Even before the ratification of the Kyoto Protocol in 2009, Reunion was already working on many projects to combat global warming, with an ecological target to be met by 2030: to achieve energy independence by using renewable energy sources, with the ultimate goal of preserving the island's biodiversity.

It is not a coincidence if Reunion is one of the most beautiful eco-responsible destinations in the world!

To help you explore Reunion, there is a great variety of activities on offer, all respectful of the environment.

Tourism on Reunion Island is developed with respect for the natural environment in mind, but for this process to be a success, everyone needs to do their part, to be "eco-friendly" citizens: so make sure you choose solar torches, kraft bags, eco-friendly flasks and sunscreens that won't harm the environment!

\* Endemic: an endemic species is a species (animal or plant) that occurs naturally in a given place, even if it has subsequently been planted or displaced worldwide.




## MAFATE, A SUSTAINABLE TOURISM LAB

## THE ISLAND OF A THOUSAND WATERFALLS

Reunion Island's waterfalls flow from the top of the mountains through a lush backdrop of vegetation into one or more deep blue pools.

The fresh air and waters here are so refreshing, especially during the austral summer. Often, you can only access and admire these waterfalls and pools on foot.

You are pretty much guaranteed sunny weather if you choose to take part in one of the exceptional experiences, supervised by professionals: swimming, excursions, canyoning.

## THE VOILE DE LA MARIÉE WATERFALL

This superb, legendary waterfall, known as the Bride's Veil is located in the Cirque of Salazie, and runs down the slopes through lush and abundant vegetation, to resemble a long, undulating veil.

The Voile de la Mariée can be seen from the road. For an additional experience, you can choose to hike to the pool at the foot of the waterfalls.

## TAKAMAKA WATERFALL

In the east of the island, on the road that runs alongside the Rivière des Marsouins, you'll come across the sublime Takamaka waterfall surrounded by lush tropical vegetation. From the footpath, you'll have the opportunity to admire the many waterfalls and pools where you can stop to cool off or indulge in your favourite activity: canyoning.

## **BLANCHE WATERFALL**

With a height of 640 metres, this waterfall is the third highest in France according to the list of the highest waterfalls in the world.

Blanche waterfall is in the Cirque of Salazie and can be reached after a short walk through lush vegetation and fruit orchards, and past some small Creole "cases" (houses).

Then you will have a panoramic view of this magnificent waterfall. It is possible to abseil down Blanche waterfall.


## LANGEVIN WATERFALL

The Langevin or Grand Galet waterfall is in in the wild south, in Saint-Joseph, and is actually several small waterfalls, spread across a rocky wall covered in vegetation and plunging into a large pool of clear, deep-blue water. It is an idyllic setting for swimming and canyoning.

The banks of the Langevin river are popular for Sunday picnics.

## TROU DE FER

Spectacular images of this site are already famous around the world. Trou de Fer canyon is 300 metres deep and is a geological curiosity. The magnificent waterfalls plunge into the deep cirque in this extraordinary natural environment. It is possible to fly over Bélouve in a helicopter, for a spectacular view of the canyon from up above. This is is the highest waterfall on French territory with a height of 725 metres.

Several species roam the waters of Reunion Island: the Spinner dolphin, the Spotted dolphin, Fraser's dolphin, and the Common Bottlenose dolphin, which can be observed all year round. And, in the absence of mermaids, you will be enchanted by the song of humpback whales! The waters of Reunion are particularly popular with these cetaceans who come here to give birth from June to October.

It is a once-in-a-lifetime experience to witness the incredible synchronised swimming shows of these majestic mammals!



During the austral winter, after a long journey all the way from the Antarctic, humpback whales arrive on the coast of Reunion Island every year, choosing the warm waters of the Indian Ocean to bring their offspring into the world.

Nature lovers flock to the island to be in with a chance of catching a glimpse of the incredible show put on by these giants of the seas, and some of the lucky ones are even treated to an unforgettable encounter with one of these creatures, at the heart of the Indian Ocean. To ensure that whale watching as an activity is developed in a sustainable way and to ensure the well-being of these animals, a set of rules to respect when approaching whales was established in 2010, and modified in 2017 for the World Humpback Whale Congress that was held in Saint-Leu.



## CODE OF GOOD CONDUCT

Reunion Island has its very own team to raise awareness, its own certification, decree from the prefecture, and tools for encouraging respectful ways of approaching and observing marine mammals and sea turtles! A Code of Good Conduct for approaching and observing these animals in a responsible manner was established in 2009 on Reunion Island. This year, the Code of Good Conduct is being updated by the CEDTM (Centre for the Study and Discovery of Sea Turtles), Globice and the Marine Nature Reserve. The code features recommendations for the respectful approach and observation of animals from a boat and in the water.



Don your masks, fins and snorkel! Dolphins come to Reunion Island all year round. Water temperatures range from 22-23°C during the austral winter (May to October) to 27-30°C in the lagoon during the summer (November to April).

The Lagon de l'Hermitage in Saint-Gilles in the west of the island, which is fully classified as a marine reserve, is the largest, widest and best preserved on Reunion Island. The crystal-clear waters are shallow (less than 2-m deep) and are dotted with corals, making it the island's most popular place for snorkelling, protected from the choppy Indian Ocean by a coral reef.

## BOTANICAL GARDENS AND WALKS

Thanks to the presence of both endemic (found exclusively on the island) and native (introduced by man) species, the flora of Reunion is diverse and extremely rich. If you would like the opportunity to learn about and admire the variety of species that grow in the island's preserved primary forests, then come and visit the gardens and admire the exotic and colourful flowers, take a stroll along the botanical trails, past the rare trees.

## JARDIN DES PARFUMS ET DES ÉPICES (GARDEN OF FRAGRANCES AND SPICES) IN SAINT-PHILIPPE

Come to this garden in the middle of the Mare Longue forest to marvel at remarkable trees, some of them centuries old. All your senses will be heightened here, as you discover more than 1,500 species of plants, trees and flowers, including fragrant plants, spices, medicinal plants, ferns, orchids and palm trees.

## LE JARDIN D'ÉDEN (GARDEN OF EDEN) IN SAINT-GILLES

In this superb 2.5-hectare garden, you will be walking past some 700 species (bamboo, aquatic plants, aromatic plants, collection of geraniums, blue flowers, a stream of taros). Children will be fascinated watching the bees go about their busy day in their hives. You will be amazed by the sheer variety of colours and scents on this unique and fascinating walk.



## MASCARIN, REUNION'S BOTANICAL GARDEN IN SAINT-LEU

Wander around this magnificent botanical reserve that includes a wide range of Reunion Island's plant species. In this historic place, there is a bamboo ravine, a collection of "lontan" plants (the plants of yesteryear), the orchard, succulent plants, palms, orchids and ferns, as well as a collection of coffee trees.

The Garden also houses the Conservatoire

## SENTIER BOTANIQUE DE LA PROVIDENCE IN SAINT-DENIS

On the outskirts of Saint-Denis, the botanical trail starts in the Forêt de la Providence perched between the town and the mountains, with the ocean on the horizon. This trail is suitable for families with children and takes you on an exploration of endemic plants, animal and plant species, with some spectacular, plunging views of the town down below. It is also where the GR®R2 "Grande Randonnée" hiking trail starts, running from Saint-Denis in the north, to Saint-Philippe in the south of the island.

## THE BÉBOUR BÉLOUVE TRAIL IN SALAZIE

Venture along the paths through the Bébour-Bélouve forest. It's worth the detour! The Petite-Plaine botanical trail will lead you through the Cryptomerias, then the primary forest, ideal for picnics, and is crisscrossed with paths, one of which skirts the Piton Bébour. You will then be walking across a diverse range of vegetation, with its subtle fragrances. Don't miss the viewpoint overlooking the Trou de Fer canyon.

## LE JARDIN DES MILLE ET UNE SAVEURS IN SAINT-ANDRÉ

At the typical Creole garden, the Jardin des Mille et Une Saveurs in Saint André, you will be whisked away on an amazing journey. Come and discover the flowers (bird-of-paradise, ylang-ylang, etc.), fruit (banana, pitaya, mango, guava, starfruit, bilimbi, etc.), herbs, spices, medicinal plants, and trees (palm, vacoa, avocado, voa vanga, papaya, etc.) in this "garden of a thousand and one flavours".

# Zooloniov On the ultimate island

During your walks, open your eyes and you might just catch a glimpse of the shimmering lizards and unusual Panther Chameleons, which blend into the scenery and walk in slow motion.

You'll be amazed by the chirping call of the house gecko which could easily be mistaken for a crazy laugh (communicative!). Just listen and enjoy this rather atypical chirping sound, coming from the King of metamorphosis.





## DID YOU KNOW?

Barav's Petrel is a species of marine bird endemic to the island. It finds its food at sea, then comes to take refuge on the Piton des Neiges at an altitude of between 2,700 and 2,900 m.

On Reunion Island, there are 560 species of butterflies, including 190 endemic species, which swirl gracefully around you and make their colours dance in amongst the flowers! Can you hear something rustling in the foliage? It's most probably a Tailless Tenrec! This small nocturnal animal looks a bit like a hedgehog.

The fauna of Reunion is most definitely original.

## RAINBOW-COLOURED PLUMAGE

Carried over by the wind, birds had settled on Reunion Island long before the first sailor took a step on the land.

The original fauna has been reduced to less than a dozen endemic bird species, some of which are unfortunately endangered. Among these precious birds, the Reunion Cuckooshrike will accompany you along the forest paths of the Roche Écrite nature reserve, and the majestic Reunion Harrier, the only raptor on the island, with its 1.2-metre wingspan, dominates the skies above the cirques and is one of the rarest birds in the world! As for the even rarer Barau's Petrel, it nests at very high altitudes, especially in the foothills of the Piton des Neiges or Grand Bénare. Along the coast, you'll see the Tropicbirds, the island's beautiful, iconic seabird, elegantly hovering above your head. This protected species with an aerodynamic silhouette ending with two half-metre long feathers and a white coat adorned with a few black lines, nests mainly in the cliffs.

While walking in the forests of Bébour-Bélouve, you can observe species that do not exist anywhere else in the world, such as the Mascarene Paradise Flycatcher, with grey, red and bluish hues, which will gladly approach you, the Reunion Grey White-Eye, a small passerine with a ring of white feathers that resemble glasses, who likes to explore the small bushes and flowers, and the flamboyant Red Fody (also called a Cardinal), whose red plumage reminds us of the cassocks of the Catholic cardinals.

During your walks, other variegated birds will attract your attention, such as the Reunion Stonechat with its white eyebrows, the bright yellow Village Weaver and the Common Waxbill, who looks like he's wearing a red mask! Only the dodo is missing. Until the 17th century, Reunion Island was the kingdom of this plump bird, which unfortunately was not able to withstand human invasion.

Red Fodies, Tropicbirds, falcons, Mascarene Paradise Flycatchers, Reunion Cuckooshrikes, Reunion Harriers, YabAlex knows everything there is to know about the birds of Reunion. This Fine Arts graduate has been specialised in wildlife photography for 20 years, he travels around Reunion photographing the most beautiful birds and he also raises awareness for their protection. He shares his passion through beautiful books and colourful exhibitions.

We interviewed this photographer to get a better idea of how he sees his island through his lens.

Reunion is an island that cannot be summarised through picture postcards. What would you say to those who are visiting the island to support this? Reunion is so much more than a postcard showing a sunny beach with coconut trees. Within ten minutes of your arrival on the island, you can find yourself in the mountains, surrounded by lush vegetation and incredible trails. However, the temperatures in the Highlands are not at all the same as the seaside! So, to visit the island, you'll need to pack more than just your "savates deux doigts" (flip flops)! (laughs)

## Which bird do you most like to photograph?

And which is the most elusive?

The Mascarene Paradise Flycatcher<sup>1</sup>, "Zoizo la Vierge" in Creole. In my opinion, it is the most beautiful bird with its red, grey and bluish black shades. Also, this bird can only be found in the forest, a place where I particularly like to work, with pleasant temperatures and some great walks. The advantage is that you can photograph the Mascarene Paradise Flycatcher while walking, you don't have to stay hidden. The most elusive bird is the Reunion

Harrier<sup>2</sup> because, with its piercing gaze and its high point of view compared to us poor earthlings, it cannot be easily photographed. To succeed, you'll need to track them, wear camouflage and have a lot of patience!

Would you say that you hunt your subjects with the stealth of a lynx, with the sharp vision of an eagle or do you have your own unique approach? Just like the lynx, I venture into the very heart of the forest, I know how to be discreet and, even if I am a little short-sighted, I have a sharp eye to photograph my subjects! (Laughs) And, like the lynx, I also have good hearing! That is a practical skill, because it means I can recognise the birds by their song.

## What landscape of Reunion do you admire the most?

The pastures of the Chaloupe Saint-Leu, with the beautiful Highland tamarinds in the centre. This is the place where I spent my childhood, the place where I played with my brothers and cousins. It's a moving place that really whisks me back to my childhood. When I go there to take pictures, I always make sure I have the time to stop, take a moment and enjoy the sunset.

## What would you advise those who, like you, would like to photograph the most beautiful plumages of Reunion Island?

I would tell them to go along the La Roche Écrite trail to enjoy the beautiful colours of the Forêt des Hauts, the tamarind forests and the fabulous view of Mafate and Salazie. It is also the only place where you can find all the forest birds that are endemic to the island because the Reunion Cuckooshrike does not live anywhere else.

## And for those who prefer selfies, where can they find the perfect backdrop?

The viewpoint at the Trou de Fer because you have to cross through the magnificent Bélouve forest before getting there and then, as a final bonus, you can take a selfie up above the vast canyon and its extraordinary waterfalls.

You can see how adventurous you really are on one of the fantastic hikes around the peaks. Are you more into James Bond? Then go for a gyropod, flyboard, jet-skiing experience, go diving, free falling, or even fly over the island in a microlight or helicopter.

Finally, if you share the passion of diver Jacques Mayol, there is more than enough to get your gills fluttering in our magical lagoons or in the depths of the Indian Ocean.





## ON LAND

There are countless activities to choose from on dry land on Reunion: stunning golf courses, treetop adventure parks and climbing, picturesque horse rides, different levels of hikes, and many other activities for visitors who are itching to get out and explore the island! With its flora, mountains and breath-taking views, the island is most definitely worthy of its reputation as a hiker's paradise. Family walks to let off steam with the children or long-distance hikes for the more adventurous, there's something for all levels and for all tastes!

Are you passionate about astronomy? At nightfall, follow a guide to a fairy-tale like clearing to contemplate the starry sky. If it's volcanoes that fascinate you, step into the depths of the Earth and explore the lava tunnels with a caving expert. You can also choose trekking, Nordic walking, eco-walks, sporty hikes or bivouac outings.



The mountain can also be explored on a canyoning outing, with natural slides that guarantee a real rush of adrenaline, or why not take on the staggering cliffs at one of the twenty-odd climbing sites, or explore on horseback,

## THE UNMISSABLE "DIAGONALE DES FOUS"

The Grand Raid is the main ultra-trail running race organised on Reunion Island and one of the most difficult in the world. This event is held in October, and involves crossing the island, from Saint-Pierre to Saint-Denis, passing through the Piton de la Fournaise mountains and the Cirques of Cilaos and Mafate. This route, which is both steep and complex, has been dubbed the "Diagonale des Fous" (Madmen's Diagonal). This iconic race on Reunion island is popular with some of the best trail-runners in the world, who come to face the highly trained local runners, all with one thing in common: passion for this discipline! The number of available places is limited so book yours early.

There are three other routes that all take place at the same time: the Mascareignes, the Trail de Bourbon and the Zembrocal Trail.

Comfortably seated in a boat with a transparent bottom, you can watch the underwater parade without getting wet. 

Like Jasmine and Aladdin on their magic flying carpet, in the skies of Reunion you'll discover a whole new world, filled with colours, you'll feel weightless in the blue sky and your heart will be doing somersaults. There's nothing more to say, on Reunion Island, you'll be on a constant high!



## FLY OVER THE ISLAND IN A HELICOPTER

With your helmet firmly attached, you will be sitting at the front, next to the pilot. After gaining altitude, the Ultimate Island will unfold below you from a new angle and you'll become even more aware of the sheer variation of the landscapes. You'll fly over the lagoon, over the steaming Piton de la Fournaise, the glowing scenery of the Plaine des Sables, the magnificent hamlets of Mafate, the lush vegetation of Salazie and the staggering slopes of Cilaos. You'll skim over the cliff face and the magnificent Trou de Fer waterfall, a highlight of the trip! After this 45-minute awe-inspiring ride, you'll land back on the ground, your heart still spinning like the blades of the helicopter!



## PARACHUTE JUMPING

Go to the Pierrefonds airport in Saint-Pierre. You'll feel such excitement when you are greeted and briefed by your instructor, before climbing aboard a helicopter! At an altitude of 3,000 m, the side door opens. Harnessed to your tandem jumper, you let go. Literally. Together, you'll free fall into the air, with the Piton des Neiges, the Grand Bénare and the Indian Ocean down below you. Then, as the parachute unfolds, your speed will stabilise and you can just sit back and enjoy the incredible views. Back on earth, you will be overwhelmed by a feeling of fulfilment. You will have just had one of the most intense experiences of your life!

The time for your introduction to paragliding has come!
With Rémi, several times crowned champion of Reunion,
you'll take the Colimaçons road, into the highlands of Saint-Leu.
At an altitude of 800 m, you'll reach the take-off zone.
The view from up here is glorious. When all the usual safety checks have been carried out, you'll be given the green light.
You'll run straight down the grassy slope, towards the sea.
The paraglider sail will inflate and your feet will rise off the ground.
When you're in the sky, Rémi will give you the controls. Turning right, then left, you'll be soaring through the air just like a tropicbird, looking to use updrafts for the ultimate thrills.
Up there, in the peaceful Reunion sky, your eyes will gaze over Saint-Leu and its surroundings. A few moments later, you'll land gently on the sand, your head still in the clouds.

## LIVING TOGETHER IN HARMONY ON REUNION

Just a mere 350 years ago, the first settlers arrived on the island, from all different walks of life, people with African, European and Asian roots. Reunion Island is an exemplary melting pot, and the key values of the island are respect, kindness and sharing. Here, different cultures and religions live together and embrace each other in perfect harmony. A warm welcome, colourful architecture, exciting museums, wild dances, captivating shows and intoxicating music, that's what Reunion Island is all about.



## THE UNION OF CULTURES

The different religions and traditions present on the island flourish in this special land where respect and tolerance are key values. In the city centres of Saint-Denis or Saint-Pierre, it is not uncommon to hear the muezzin, church bells and malbar drums sound at the same time, in perfect communion. You are guaranteed an incredible

experience if you take part in the various colourful and festive celebrations that are held throughout the year! In February, the spectacular Chinese New Year is celebrated all over the island, with its famous dragon dance and many other shows.

At Eid al-Fitr, which marks the end of Ramadan, it is common practice to pray outdoors.

The Hindu religion is also celebrated with Diwali, the Tamil Festival of Light, the Tamil New Year, in April and the impressive firewalking events, from December to January.

Finally, do not miss the celebrations of the abolition of slavery that take place just before Christmas, on 20 December.

The sounds of Maloya, Sega and Moraingy echo through the streets. Parades, songs, dances and percussion are celebrated across the island during the Kaf Festival.

## A CLOSER LOOK...

## **CHURCH OF SAINTE-ANNE**

This Catholic church has a unique architecture, combining Gaudian and Baroque art, and was the location for Jean-Paul Belmondo and Catherine Deneuve's wedding.
That is, in Truffaut's film "Mississippi Mermaid". It was built in 1857 and finished in 1863, and has been improved over time by magnificent mouldings, coloured frescoes and a small chapel built in honour of Sainte-Thérèse by Father Georges Daubenberger from Strasbourg in 1921

It can be seen from a distance thanks to its high steeple towering over the forest canopy, its original colours and the surprising carvings of the mouldings. Take a guided tour of this holy place, classified as a Historic Monument since 1982 and, under the watchful eyes of cement statues and gargoyles, learn about its entire history, in 45 minutes flat!



MORE INFO **ABOUT** MUSEUMS





Art is all around you on the Ultimate Island. Take the time to come and admire it in the many shops, museums and galleries where it is proudly displayed. Reunion Island strives to value its local resources and traditions in adopting a boldly creative and modern approach. Contemporary art is also celebrated at the Artothèque and in many galleries.

At the Musée Léon-Dierx, you can admire works by Picasso, Gauguin, Cézanne, Renoir and Caillebotte, as well as paintings by local artists Arthur Grimaud, Adolphe Le Roy and Antoine-Louis Roussin. The collections also include photographs so visitors can discover the 19<sup>th</sup> century landscapes of Reunion Island. "Pei" (local) crafts can also be seen all over the island.

The island is particularly famous for its baskets, which are woven using screw pine leaves, and for its creations made from volcanic stone, lava, tortoiseshell, wood, ceramics and embroidery. There are almost 420 professionals making jewellery, knick-knacks and marquetry.

Nestled at the heart of the Cirques of Salazie, Mafate and Cilaos. there are villages and small hamlets called "îlets", where the locals go about their easy-going, Creole way of life surrounded by an unspoilt natural environment. Bourg-Murat, la Plaine des Palmistes, Grand-Coude, Petite-Ile, Petite-France, La Plaine des Cafres... each village atmosphere, but they all live by the values of nature

The viewpoint from Les Makes acts much like an astronomical observatory, with an endless view of the horizon stretching off into the distance. In the Maïdo Forests, at the heart of La Réunion National Park, diverse, one-of-a-kind ecosystems unfold before your eyes. In Bourg-Murat, you'll discover the local atmosphere and Creole flavours with its dairy cow farms and pink berry honey. In Saint-Leu, the atmosphere is more coastal, with the coral reef and the waves flowing into the "souffleurs" (blowholes), before crashing back, sometimes up to several metres high. At the Plaine des Palmistes, L'Entre-Deux and Hell-Bourg, explore the pretty villas that wealthy families had built in the mountains to escape the heat of the austral summer, as well as the traditional coloured metal houses surrounded by gardens full of flowers.

As you stroll through Hell-Bourg, a former spa town resort with an old-fashioned charm and the only overseas town listed among the 'Most Beautiful Villages in France', admire the colourful façades along the General de Gaulle shopping street, the glimmering cemetery, enjoy an entertaining and educational visit to Maison Folio and the Musée des Musiques et Instruments de l'Océan Indien (Museum of Indian Ocean Music and Instruments). In L'Entre-Deux, learn about the history of those who decided to live deep in the mountains

of the island, whether they were settlers or former slaves on the run, known as "Marrons", or craftsmen. The houses they lived in are full of memories and it's possible to learn about the rich past through the architecture of this charming village. Although the walls speak for themselves, nothing beats human contact along the family-friendly trails. After photographing the huts that look like houses straight out of a fairy-tale, don't miss the opportunity to chat to the locals of Saint-Leu and the artisans working with chocolate, coconut or coffee, emblems of the village. They will be





## LA MAISON FOLIO: A FIRM FAVOURITE

If you want to take a trip back in time, push open the door of Maison Folio, in Hell-Bourg. You will find yourself in a time when the prominent Creole families of the island left the warmth of the coast, in search of comfort in the cooler temperatures of the Highlands, in charming, stylish little Creole houses.

built in the 19th century, your guide will talk about the antique furniture, everyday objects of the time and local handicrafts, with an added touch of humour, and interesting anecdotes and traditions. But the highlight of this place is most definitely the garden. It is a perfect representation of the Creole way of life, with its "quétali"

(kiosk), fountain, paths paved with old stone, its many aromatic and medicinal plants and the exotic scents.



## **CULTURAL HERITAGE** HISTORIC MONUMENTS

If only the walls could speak... If they could, we imagine that those on the island of a thousand faces would be particularly talkative! Reunion is the French overseas department with the most Historic Monuments, 192 in total, 18 of which are classified.

All these buildings reveal an episode in the history of the island. Industrial heritage occupies a special place, especially the former sugar or railway factories in particular (Reunion is the only French overseas department to have owned a railway). But the island's Historic Monuments are incredibly diverse: churches, fountains, villas, bridges, chimneys, lighthouses, cemeteries, gardens, temples, etc.





The Rivière de l'Est suspension bridge

Here's an historic monument that really can look down upon the others. Suspended 42 m above the Rivière de l'Est, it is a fine sight. It is 152 metres long, making it the longest bridge in the world when it was completed in 1894. This was a major innovation on Reunion because it offered an alternative to transporting sugar cane by fording the river, which was too risky and unreliable.

For this suspension bridge project, the engineers and industrialists Ferdinand Arnodin and Pierre-Joseph Bonnin pipped Gustave Eiffel

at the post and their construction, with its 103 kilometres of cables, its 61 tonnes of sheet metal and 25,000 kilograms of cast iron has resisted all the tropical cyclones that have hit the island and the landslide that caused a considerable flood in 1927.

It is no longer possible to walk across this bridge as it has been closed to pedestrians since 2016. But nothing prevents you from admiring it and enjoying the plunging view of the banks of the Rivière de l'Est. On the road between Sainte-Rose and Saint-Benoît, you cannot miss it!



The master houses are huge and most definitely leave an impression with their colonnades and their beautiful gardens, in "Gone with the wind" style, that would not look out of place on programmes about historic, luxury houses.

On Rue de Paris in Saint-Denis, a veritable open-air museum, there are a few examples of these charming Creole houses. Some are even classified as Historic Monuments or have been transformed into beautiful museums.

Others remain mysterious, hidden behind large wrought iron gates. The Maison Martin Valliamé in Saint-André, the Villèle museum (formerly Maison Desbassayns) in Saint-Gilles or the Tourelles estate in La Plaine-des-Palmistes are also worth a visit.




## THE GUÉTALI (KIOSK)

A CLOSER LOOK...

In old Creole society, you had to be able to see without being seen... For this, the "quétali" (meaning "watch for it"), a small open kiosk, was the ideal place!

In some gardens, you can still see these shelters, worthy of a Jane Austen novel, a perfect place to criticise (or gossip) discreetly, or to lie in wait for your lover and exchange sweet words! On Reunion Island, second homes are called a "change of air".

## THE SOUND OF MUSIC



The Ultimate Island is full of musical treasures such as Sega and Maloya, both inherited from the Reunion ancestors and classified as Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO.

Maloya, originally played practised by the African and Malagasy slaves on the plantations on L'île Bourbon as it was known back then, was banned in the city until recently. It was only in 1982 that it was allowed to be played freely! An ode to pain, melancholy and hope, it can be compared to the "blues" of the American slaves in its origins but is, on the other hand, very different from a musical point of view. Based on a ternary rhythm, it uses mainly percussion instruments: bob¹, kayamb², roulèr³, piker⁴, ... So, listen up and enjoy the sounds of "roulèr, kayamb, djembé and pikèr"!

## TAKE MY HAND AND DANCE!

Besides the traditional dances, Reunion dance today has a real creative dynamic, with several original professional choreographic companies and a significant rise in modern and urban dance.

The island's musical heritage has evolved.

Electronic sounds, rap, etc. have taken root and are now blended with new artists and new scenes which can be seen at popular festivals such as the Sakifo de Saint-Pierre, which is particularly popular with some of the big names on the national and international scene, the Electropicales de Saint-Denis, the Grand Boucan de Saint-Gilles, the Indian Ocean Jazz Festival, and many others!





The Sakifo Musik Festival comes to Saint-Pierre every year and sounds from all over the world echo through the town for 3 days. This cocktail of pop, rock, electronic music, French music, blues, reggae, funk, music from Africa and the Indian Ocean, is a must-see and attracts up to 40,000 spectators every year!

## A UNIQUE PAUSE


Like a game of "Happy Families"! The Pounia family is made up of the father, mother, grandmother, son and daughter. The artist's life and the stage have become a family affair.

The father, Gilbert Pounia, is the historic leader of the Ziskakan group, established in 1979 using the texts of Reunion poets and writers. This songwriter, who used maloya with a hint of rock and Indian sounds, enriched and modernised the musical palette of Reunion. He took Reunion culture out into the world, beyond the island's borders, with his albums, surrounding himself with talented musicians.

The mother, Anny Grondin, is the storyteller. She talks passionately about her identity, culture and the Creole language. Kriké, Kraké! She tells stories of Reunion and elsewhere in schools, festivals and multimedia libraries.

The daughter, Maya Kamaty, is an author, composer, and performer of a blend of electro, pop and Maloya. Her captivating voice resonates in India, Australia, Morocco, Canada, as well as mainland France and on Reunion Island

The son, Wazis Loy Pounia, is a bassist and percussionist for the group Ziskakan. The whole Pounia family comes together at Zinzin in Grand Bois in the south of the island. A unique place where Reunion culture meets gastronomy, poetry, stories and music. Under the watchful eye of grandfather Clovis whose portrait hangs on the wall, the game of Happy Families is played out. The Pounia family also includes the maternal grandparents Odette and Lucien, grandmother Nadine, and son-in-law, Guillaume. 



Reunion Island is an intensely gourmet island and, at mealtimes, the Reunion value of sharing takes on its full meaning! Don't hesitate to have a chat with the locals of the island. Who knows, perhaps you will be invited to a traditional family picnic over the weekend? "Don't be afraid to venture off the beaten track for new food experiences! Curiosity and improvisation are your best allies when exploring the island and its inhabitants."

Just like in cooking and religion here, the traditions reflect the mixed population. Christmas, Chinese New Year, fire walking, cock fights, picnics,"pain bouchon" (local bread), fairground markets, Maloya and much more.

All these traditions and many others illustrate the rich cultural diversity of the Ultimate Island.





## PICNIC-MANIA

A true institution, the picnic alone represents the Reunion way of life. Throughout the year, on weekends or during school holidays, the locals of the island get together for some quality time with family or friends.

At the seaside, on the sand, they recreate their dining rooms with tables, chairs, fabrics, pots full of rice, sausages, boucané (smoked pork) and other delicious provisions! In the Highlands, in the Lowlands, in the forests, near a waterfall, a river or facing the ocean, the whole island can provide the prime spot for these festive outdoor meals.

## AWAKEN YOUR TASTEBUDS

On Reunion, diversity is also found on your plate! Local gastronomy includes European, Chinese, Indian and Malagasy influences. Reunion cuisine is authentic, generous and colourful, and has something to satisfy everyone.

You will find yourself using, perhaps to excess, various adjectives such as delicious, tasty, succulent, divine, when you taste the island's food. Note to all passengers, do not tighten your belt too much, you are about to embark on an incredible culinary

There is only one menu like this in the world, with a French base, a pinch of Malagasy customs, a zest of Chinese know-how and a hint of Indian flavours! Rice, grains, rougail: the mythical trilogy behind traditional Reunion cuisine is a

journey!

example of this. Lightly fry the meat, fish or vegetables, add finely sliced onions, tomatoes, garlic, ginger, turmeric, salt, pepper and thyme and simmer it all together.

Serve with rice and a few brèdes (a kind of spinach) and there you have a delicious traditional dish of Reunion to enjoy at will! If you are fond of Indian cuisine, opt for a biryani, a tandoori or a rooster massalé, a dish in a sauce made with coriander, cumin, chilli pepper, curry leaves and tamarind pulp. Are you dreaming at the thought of a good stew? Rooster stew, zourites (octopus) stew, duck stew, venison stew... you'll be spoilt for choice!

As an added bonus, you'll find all the best products of the Indian Ocean on your plate, including avocados with prawns, green papaya salads or smoked fish (swordfish, blue marlin, tuna, mahi-mahi...)!

## ALL KINDS OF RUM



## FROM CANE SUGAR TO RUM

On Reunion, sugar is not only used to add to your tea! It is part of the culture, history, and heritage.

Sugar cane has played a significant role in shaping the island's economy, therefore also forging the destiny of the island.

During the tour of the island's distilleries and its two gigantic sugar factories still in operation, you will learn all about the production of cane sugar and local rum, which is 'arrangé' (macerated) most of the time.

It is indeed mixed with delicious fruit that is left to macerate for between six months and two years with, for example, a wild orchid such as "faham" (Jumellea fragrans), or other plants and spices. All the tropical fruit of Reunion is used to make macerated rum that sounds rather appealing: coconut-rum, vanilla-rum, pineapple-rum, etc. For a great ending to a good Creole meal, macerated rum is a must!

## **SIP THE SWEET BEVERAGES**

In Reunion culinary traditions, the "aperitif" is particularly important. It must be said that the summer atmosphere, 365 days a year, is particularly well-suited to this tradition.

To accompany the sunset on the beach, you can enjoy samosas, "bouchons" and chilli bites, and toast to the holidays with a local beer (dodo) or a delicious beverage made with rum.

L'Entre-Deux, La Fournaise, Le Punch Coco (coconut punch), Le Baiser Tropical (tropical kiss), Le Nirvana,

Le Flamboyant... Here, even the names of the cocktails take you on a journey!
So, as we say, "anou"! Or "cheers"!
And don't forget to drink with moderation...

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## Rougail saucisses\* (\*Sausages rougail)

The unmissable rougail saucisses (with pork or chicken sausages according to your taste) is one of the most famous dishes of Reunion cuisine. Serve with white rice, grains.

When the tomatoes are cooked, the sauce should be thick and dark red. Do not add water. You can add large chilli peppers (finely cut lengthwise) to your rougail saucisses.

## Cari poulet \* (\*Chichen cari)

Chicken cari is one of the most familiar dishes in Reunion Island cuisine and very easy to make.

Preferably choose a free-range chicken.

The version with tomatoes is the most widespread and best known, but traditionally this dish was prepared without tomatoes. Why not organise a picnic with family or friends by the sea, under the casuarina trees or at the heart of the mountain in the picnic areas, and enjoy your chicken cari all together?

- Working the dough is about making contact between the fat, which is butter in this case, and the different dry ingredients.
- Combine the flour, salt, turmeric, sugar and butter.
- Then add the egg and water.
- Mix evenly to obtain a good dough. Cover with film and leave in the refrigerator for about 20 mins.
- After resting, roll out the dough the size of the pan with a rolling pin.
- Let the dough cool for a few minutes.
- Prick the dough with a fork.
- Cook in a 160°C oven for 10/15 mins, checking how brown it is.
- Leave to cool.

## 2nd step:

## Garnish:

## Bring a saucepan of water to the boil.

- Score the heirloom tomatoes (not the cherry tomatoes) gently in the shape of a cross.
- Plunge these tomatoes for several seconds in hot water, and once the skin begins to separate, remove them from the water and place them into cold water. Drain them and gently remove the tomato skins.
- Cut the tomatoes into quarters.
- Set aside the tomato quarters.
- Lay the tomato skins on baking paper with a pinch of salt and put in the oven to dry at 80°C.
- Cut the cherry tomatoes into quarters.
- Season the tomatoes with the fleur de sel, pepper, olive oil and balsamic vinegar.
- Wash the spring onions and dice them at an angle.
- Wash the large pepper and cut into cubes.
- Break up the feta. Season with olive oil, pepper and turmeric.

## Presentation:

- On the base of the tart, place the pieces of feta, and then the tomato quarters on top.
- Sprinkle over the spring onions and the chopped green pepper.
- Finish by adding the dried tomato skins.
- Add the chives or small basil leaves.



Come to Grand-Coude, in the highlands of Saint-Joseph, to a farm that is both beautiful and rare. Johny and Emmanuelle, the only tea producers in France, will welcome you to their real plant maze, where you can rediscover your inner child in the shade of the giant tea plants.

Tea leaves falling into the hot water of a Chinese emperor, the eyelids of a Buddhist monk transformed into a tea tree, there are countless legends on the topic of tea. Does Reunion tea have its own mythology?

The legends that come to mind are much less poetic... one of them claims tea miraculously helps people lose weight. Although it can help those who consume it regularly to lower their cholesterol and is a good addition to diets, it is unfortunately not a magic potion! (laughs)

## On your farm, you also use geranium. Can you tell us about some of its virtues?

There are so many, where do I start? (Laughs) Geranium is perfect for lowering blood sugar levels. Those with diabetes should consume it regularly. As an infusion, as an evening herbal tea, it promises a restful night because it is also very relaxing. It can also be used in the bath! It is often recommended by inhalation for those who have the flu, and in a diffuser for asthmatics. It is good for the skin, especially for treating sunburn. It is increasingly found in cosmetics because it is restorative, protective, soothing, calming and purifying. Finally, it is a very good mosquito repellent. Used in a diffuser, it is very effective at keeping them at bay. We distil it and you can find it as an essential oil and a hydrolat.

## Which place do you always want to come back to again and again?

Cilaos. The route to get there is already a journey in itself! (Laughs) And then, when you get there, you really feel like you're at the heart of Reunion Island, in a special place. With the lush vegetation, the waterfalls, it's the apotheosis of nature!

## Tell us about a place that always leaves you speechless.

I'm hesitating... Le Pas de Bellecombe. Discovering this lunar landscape on the way to the volcano really moves me every time. But I've seen Cap Jaun in a photo and I think it looks beautiful too. I can't wait to see it "in the flesh".

## Without taking into account specific tastes and colours, which Reunion speciality is unanimous?

Rougail saucisses (sausages)! It has sometimes been copied outside of Reunion Island but it's never the same. (laughs)

## Of the 5 basic tastes (salty, sweet, sour, bitter, umami), which one would you attribute the most to the Ultimate

Salty. Spices, delicious dishes, the sea... that's Reunion! But it is also sweet, with all the delicious fruit.

## What would you advise those who visit the island to:

- > experience Creole culture? Discover Maloya. It is a dance, a musical genre a story and an atmosphere all rolled into one. Once you've discovered it, you're quaranteed to end up loving it. The people who dance the Maloya do not only dance, they are this dance! I would also recommend getting an experience of the religious diversity of the island because it there is so much to discover.
- > delight the taste buds? You have to go to the markets, taste everything, take in the colours and flavours. And I also recommend you taste a cari with the locals, there's nothing more authentic!
- > enjoy a moment of relaxation? Roche Plate, set apart from the rest of the world, with its dense and spectacular vegetation and its flowing river.

## What would you say to make their mouth water?

Reunion is a very rich land. Landscapes, flavours, discoveries. Here there is so much to delight the eyes and the tastebuds!





On the Ultimate Island, two volcanic ranges take up the lion's share of the land: that of the Piton de la Fournaise and the Piton des Neiges, the roof of the Indian Ocean. But the term "piton" is more widely used to refer to the numerous mountains, peaks and summits of the island and, in particular, the multitude of secondary volcanic cones. Although these small pitons, visible throughout the island, did not have a founding role, they are the remains of the innumerable eruptions that shaped the island or of the tectonic activity that led to slides and collapses of blocks of the two main pitons.







mineral, contrasting with the lush vegetation present on the rest of the island. The white marks on the ground will guide you straight to the fiery heart of the place...

The successive lava flows of the Piton de la Fournaise descended into the ocean and enlarged the island, producing a pretty impressive result. The scenery of the wild south coast is a visual treat with steep basalt cliffs, lush green vegetation and the deep blue Indian Ocean. The lava road alone is worth the journey with its flows frozen for eternity. But the discovery of the Piton de la Fournaise

**COSMIC LANDSCAPES** 

Before arriving at Pas de Bellecombe-Jacob, the starting point of the hike to the volcano, you have to cross the Plaine des Sables and its hardened lava ground and brown-orange scoria... You'll feel like you've landed on Mars! Without leaving Earth, you'll feel like astronaut Thomas Pesquet setting foot on the red planet: very, very lucky. Then, once within the enclosure of the volcano, you'll tread over the hardened lava and discover a landscape that is almost entirely

is nevertheless highly recommended!

## **AN ACTIVE VOLCANO**

Volcan la pété! (Volcano erupting!) If you hear this expression during your stay on Reunion, don't be afraid! It actually means you are one of the lucky ones, and that the iconic star of the island has woken up to dazzle its many fans once again with an unforgettable sound and light show.

The Piton de la Fournaise is one of the most active volcanoes in the world!

colossal giant, about 500,000 years old and culminating at 2,631 metres, is active every nine months on average. Despite the incandescent lava and spectacular fireworks, it is non-explosive and so is harmless. During an eruption, access to the Fouque enclosure is forbidden but you can admire the lively show from Piton de Bert or from Piton Partage. At night-time, it's even more impressive!

To enjoy the power of nature all the more and better understand it, you can also see what it's like to be a speleologist in the lava tunnels and visit the Cité du Volcan, a treasure trove of knowledge located in the Plaine des Cafres.

A SUSPENDED TUNNEL

Two of the three French volcanological

currently have female management teams.

managed by the Institut de Physique du Globe de Paris,

and seismological observatories,

Don gloves, knee pads, helmets, headlights and a shoulder harness and you'll be ready to dive, or rather to climb, into one of the largest lava tunnels of the island, born from a eruption of the Piton des Neiges, tens of thousands of years ago. At a height of 6 metres, you can tame the silence and darkness by following in the footsteps of Sébastien, your guide, through the "narrow passageway" or the "breakfast room" with its lava benches. In this mineral world, your sensations will be heightened tenfold. Tea tasting in the dark and a zipline descent will complete this extraordinary experience. Although some still walk the tunnel hoping to find Pirate Buse's treasure, it is undoubtedly on its walls, with reflections of precious stones and gold leaf, that the real treasure is to be found!

If you choose to go to the 2004 volcanic flow for a caving expedition when there's a full moon, you're in for an exceptional

Why is that you may ask... Because you'll be watching the most incredible concert ever... Accompanied by Julien, your guide, and a quartet of traditional instruments, you'll travel through a lava tunnel dotted with almost organic shapes. When you reach a small cave, you'll turn off your light, and there, the first notes will burst into the darkness, the Creole rhythms filling the air. There, under the volcano, time literally stands still and you'll find your heart starts beating very fast! When you go back to the entrance of the tunnel, the magic will continue as the light of the moon reflects onto the dark lava flows, with the sea below, creating a mysterious atmosphere.

Director of the Observatoire Volcanologique du Piton de la Fournaise (Volcano Observatory).



The first woman to hold the position of director of the "Observatoire Volcanologique du Piton de la Fournaise (OVPF)" on Reunion, Aline Peltier, lovingly watches over the "mountain of fire" that never sleeps. Observing a volcano also requires the sense of touch, to examine the texture of the scoria and collect rocks from the ground.

She agreed to tell us more about her job and her very close relationship with the Ultimate Island and its "friendly" volcano.

## You regularly share your passion with young people, so what would you say to those who dream of doing your job someday?

In two words, those who want to become a volcanologist will need, "perseverance and sacrifice" because the studies are long and the places are limited, due to the fact that there are not many French volcanoes to actually study. But, there are about 1,500 active volcanoes on the planet so there are places to fill elsewhere. Choosing this path requires sacrifices but it is a dream job so it is well worth it.

## What volcanological mystery do you dream of uncovering?

That's easy, I'd love to be able to predict the exact moment the magma will arrive at the surface. It's every volcanologist's dream. Today, we are able to have an overall vision of the activity of a volcano, in that we know an eruption is imminent, but we do not know if the eruption will take place in one week or three weeks, for example. Although we can track where the magma is, its depth, before it comes out on the surface, we unfortunately cannot say how long it will take to emerge from the depths. And there's a big difference between 20 minutes and a few hours! When we notify the prefecture, it's impossible to say "the magma will erupt at 4:43". One day perhaps...

## "Do you have green fingers, nimble fingers or are you all thumbs?" I don't have green fingers at all. All thumbs, sometimes (laughs). But when it comes to the volcano and my work, I would rather

say nimble fingers...

## Can you describe your relationship with the Piton de la Fournaise? It is an extremely strong bond.

I fell in love with this volcano in 2003, while I was doing research at the volcanological observatory during my master's degree.

Then I did everything I could to get back to work here. It is a dream volcano for any volcanologist because it erupts very frequently and it presents fewer risks than other volcanoes in the world.

## Apart from this volcano, is there anywhere else on Reunion that you love to go?

Mafate, because I hike a lot, and the hiking trails of this cirque are numerous and particularly beautiful. It is the ideal place for those who like to be close to nature. And for the best view of Mafate, the Grand Bénare is my favourite place. It offers an incredible panoramic view, with the Piton de la Fournaise in the distance.

## What do you particularly love about this fiery island?

The fact that everything is mixed and so diverse: landscapes, population, climate...

## Speaking of landscapes, is there one that particularly sets your heart "on fire"?

La Plaine des Sables, without hesitation. It is a place that is guaranteed to leave a lasting impression on whoever sees it. I'll always remember the first time I saw it. I was really awestruck!

## Which Reunion tradition do you find the most intriguing?

The Creole picnic. That probably comes from my love of food (laughs). It's a tradition I particularly like because it is the perfect example of this notion of "mixture" that is so representative of the island.

## Of all the legends and superstitions surrounding the Piton de la Fournaise, which one is your favourite?

To tell the truth, I'm not too keen on the legends about the volcano, they are too dark, too creepy!

Damned souls blowing on the embers to fan the fire of the earth, sightings of a witch who eats naughty children (Grandma Kalle), the mouth of hell, legends about slavery... no thanks!

## Where did your interest in fragrances first come from?

My childhood memories of Reunion Island. When I came to the island, I always felt like my nose was full of scents. The scents of sea spray in Saint-Leu and the unique fresh scent of L'Entre-Deux, mixed with the scent of flowers that I could not identify at the time (looking back, they must have been the flowers of mandarin trees and grapefruit) remain firmly rooted in my memory. These memories of fragrances first led me to collect small miniature vials. Then, my sensitivity, along with chance happenings in life and random meetings, led me to create perfumes and develop this workshop.

("In the fragrant land that the sun caresses"), is the beginning of the poem "À Une Dame Créole" that Charles Baudelaire wrote in 1841 on Reunion Island. What does this "fragrant land" mean to you? I love this poem. This "fragrant land" means so much to me! In particular, the idea that a tropical island can be created from the humidity of the stone and the strength of the waves. Reunion has a wild side, with the scent of sea spray and then the more mineral scent which is very much present in the south of the island, around the volcano. But it also has something very feminine about it, with the aromas

of jasmine, datura flowers and the

What do you think is the most enchanting fragrance on the island? The scent of ylang-ylang.

Which scent would you like to bottle? My daughter's scent. Like a dainty version of Jean-Baptiste Grenouille (from the novel "Perfume"). I would like to be able to scoop up this essence from her skin with a little spoon. But there is another fragrance, one that's very particular, which intrigues me and that I would like to capture: that of a wet pebble.

Can you give us two fragrances of Reunion that you think make the perfect match? The scents of vetiver and ylang-ylang.

## Where do you find your inspiration on the island?

In the highlands, after a beautiful hike. At the top of Dimitile, especially in the wild south, facing the sea. Generally speaking, the rock faces and wild nature inspire me.

For you, where can you find the ultimate holiday scent? At the beach. I am not talking about monoi oil or the smell of sunscreen, but rather the "salty" scents, which are typical

of the seaside. The beach has the scent of sand and salt that mingles with the heat of the sun. When I am asked to create a perfume, I am often asked to reproduce the fragrance of the "coast".

## Who would you like to come face-to-face with on a walk?

With Charles Baudelaire of course! He was a big part of my teenage years. His melancholic, dreamy, romantic side, but also his very dark side, fascinated me at the time and continue to fascinate me.

You have great taste, so what would you advise those who visit the island to:

- > take a breath of fresh air? Hiking in Mafate.
- > treat a loved one with a romantic outing? Walk along the small, rural footpaths, such as the wild south Coastal Trail that leads to Cap Jaune.

## DRIVING ON RÉUNION ISLAND

You must have a French or international driving licence.

The road network has almost 4,000 km of roads, including 140 km of dual carriageways, 720 km of secondary roads and more than 2,300 km of smaller roads. These roads allow you to cross the island in suitable conditions, and admire the beautiful scenery all around you. For driving, French standards apply, on the right side of the road, in application of the highway code.

## GETTING AROUND REUNION ISLAND

You are free to explore the island at your own leisure as the infrastructures meet European standards. Car rental, buses, taxis, chauffeur-driven cars, airport shuttle services, and tourist carriers provide transportation throughout the island. To reach the hiking trails, you can hire a different means of transport other than a car (4x4, motorbike, bicycle, campervan). Fuel is available across the island, at a fixed price.

Taxis are available at all times at the taxi ranks in front of the airport terminal and in the city centre. They will take you all over the island.
