

Travel Advisory on COVID-19 coronavirus outbreak

Dated 09th May 2022(Revision 0)

Prepared in accordance with IATA News daily updates and based on travel advisories that we are aware of published on May 09th, 2022.

You are advised to monitor and check official websites of World Health Organization, relevant authorities and local government agencies for the latest developments on COVID-19 coronavirus. Do adjust your travel plans based on the latest information provided.

AUSTRALIA - published 18.04.2022

1. Passengers must have a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 7 days before departure. Vaccines accepted are:

AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), AstraZeneca (Covishield), Covaxin, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTec (Comirnaty), Sinopharm (BIBP) (for passengers younger than 60 years only), Sinovac and Sputnik V.

This does not apply to:

- nationals and residents of Australia;
- passengers with an approved travel exemption. More information can be found at <https://covid19.homeaffairs.gov.au/travel-restrictions>;
- passengers traveling within passenger caps. More information can be found at <https://covid19.homeaffairs.gov.au/coming-australia> ;
- passengers younger than 12 years and 3 months at the time of departure;
- passengers between 12 and 17 years traveling with a fully vaccinated parents/guardians.

2. Passengers must complete a "Digital Passenger Declaration (DPD)" form and present it at time of check-in.

3. Passengers could be subject to quarantine for 14 days at the first point of entry. Details can be found at <https://www.australia.gov.au/states>

4. Quarantine arrangements for airline crew are subject to respective state or territory requirements.

BANGLADESH - published 25.04.2022

1. Passengers must have a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 12 years;
- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm or Sinovac.

2. Passengers entering or transiting through Bangladesh must complete a Health Declaration Form at most 3 days before departure. The form can be found at <http://healthdeclaration.dghs.gov.bd> . This will generate a QR code which must be presented before boarding and upon arrival.

3. Suspension of visa on arrival facilities.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers of Bangladeshi origins, their spouses and children;
- passengers with a diplomatic or official passport;
- passengers traveling on business.

CANADA - published 28.04.2022

1. Passengers and airline crew must have a COVID-19 vaccination certificate uploaded in ArriveCAN showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 15 days (day of vaccination + 14 days) before arrival. The certificate must be in English, French or accompanied by a certified English or French translation. Vaccines accepted are: AstraZeneca (Covishield), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covovax, Janssen, **Medicago Covifenz**, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm or Sinovac. A combination of vaccines is accepted.

- This does not apply to:

- nationals of Canada;
- permanent residents of Canada;
- persons registered under Canada's Indian Act with the Certificate of Indian Status (CIS) or the Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS);
- passengers with an authorization from the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) for compassionate entry;
- passengers with a Canadian Refugee Travel Document or a Single Journey Document for Resettlement to Canada;
- passengers younger than 18 years traveling with their vaccinated parents/guardians;
- passengers with an application for permanent residence. They must have a written notice issued under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act;
- nationals of Ukraine and their immediate family members with a Canadian Temporary Resident Permit or a Canadian Temporary Resident Visa.

2. Passengers must have:

- a negative molecular COVID-19 test taken outside of Canada at most 72 hours before departure of the last direct flight to Canada. Tests accepted are: CRISPR, Ct, detection of the E gene, detection of the N gene, detection of Orf1a/b, detection of the RdRp gene, detection of the S gene, ddPCR, isothermal amplification, LamPORE, NAAT, NAT, NGS, PCR, qPCR, RNA, RT-LAMP, RT-PCR, sequencing and WGS; or
- a negative COVID-19 antigen test taken at most one day before departure of the last direct flight to Canada.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 5 years;
- passengers between 5 and 11 years traveling with their fully vaccinated parents/guardians;
- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 15 days (day of vaccination + 14 days) before arrival. The certificate must be in English, French or accompanied by a certified English or French translation. Vaccines accepted are: AstraZeneca (Covishield), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covovax, Janssen, Medicago Covifenz, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm or Sinovac. A combination of vaccines is accepted;
- passengers with a positive molecular COVID-19 test taken at least 10 days and at most 180 days before departure of the last direct flight to Canada. Tests accepted are: CRISPR, Ct, detection of the E gene, detection of the N gene, detection of Orf1a/b, detection of the RdRp gene, detection of the S gene, ddPCR, isothermal amplification, LamPORE, NAAT, NAT, NGS, PCR, qPCR, RNA, RT-LAMP, RT-PCR, sequencing and WGS;

3. Passengers and airline crew must submit their information electronically, at most 72 hours before arrival, through the ArriveCAN app or the website <https://www.canada.ca/en/public-health/services/diseases/coronavirus-disease-covid-19/arrivecan.html>. Passengers must present an ArriveCAN receipt before boarding.

4. Passenger could be subject to COVID-19 molecular test upon arrival. Details can be found at <https://travel.gc.ca/travel-covid/travel-restrictions/covid-vaccinated-travellers-entering-canada> for

vaccinated passengers and <https://travel.gc.ca/travel-covid/travel-restrictions/exemptions#unvaccinated> for unvaccinated passengers.

6. Passengers could be subject to quarantine for 14 days. Details can be found at <https://travel.gc.ca/travel-covid/travel-restrictions/flying-canada-checklist>

- This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 12 years traveling with their fully vaccinated parents/guardians;
- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 15 days (day of vaccination + 14 days) before arrival. The certificate must be in English or French or be accompanied by a certified translation to English or French.

- Vaccines accepted are: AstraZeneca (Covishield), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covovax, Janssen, **Medicago Covifenz**, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm or Sinovac. A combination of vaccines is accepted.

THE MAINLAND OF CHINA - published 05.04.2022

1. Entry by foreign nationals holding a visa is suspended.

- This does not apply to:

- foreign nationals with a visa issued after 28 March 2020 with the place of issue outside the Mainland of China. They must not arrive from Bangladesh, Belgium, France, India, Italy, Philippines, Russian Fed. and United Kingdom;

- foreign nationals with a diplomatic, service, courtesy or C visa;

- foreign nationals with a visa issued after 3 November 2020;

- passengers with an invitation letter issued by the Beijing Organising Committee for the 2022 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games.

2. Entry by foreign nationals with a residence permit is suspended.

- This does not apply to:

- foreign nationals with a permanent residence permit;

- foreign nationals with a residence permit with the purpose 'work', 'personal matters' or 'reunion'. They must not arrive from Bangladesh, Belgium, France, India, Italy, Philippines, Russian Fed. and United Kingdom.

3. Entry by foreign nationals with an APEC Business Travel Card is suspended.

4. Port visas, 24/72/144-hour visa-free transit policy, Hainan 30-day visa-free policy, 15-day visa-free policy specified for foreign cruise-group-tour through Shanghai Port, Guangdong 144-hour visa-free policy specified for foreign tour groups from Hong Kong or Macao SAR, and Guangxi 15-day visa-free policy specified for foreign tour groups of ASEAN countries are suspended.

5. Foreign nationals coming to the mainland of China for necessary economic, trade, scientific or technological activities or out of emergency humanitarian needs may apply for visas at Chinese embassies or consulates.

6. Passengers are subject to medical screening and quarantine for up to 21 days at the first point of entry.

7. Airline crew of foreign airlines:

- are not required to undergo nucleic acid test if they have a short stay after landing then depart immediately, and do not leave apron during the transition; OR

- shall receive nucleic acid test in the first port of entry if they need to enter the country to rest or continue to operate domestic routes. The test results will be confirmed by the local government in accordance with the requirements of epidemic prevention management. Only if the test results are negative, crews can continue the operations; OR

- are allowed to return to their home country for isolation treatment when agreed by the local joint control mechanism, if they are symptomatic, in close contact with infected persons or tested positive. Airlines and crews shall make all commitments to bear their responsibilities and also carry out strict protections.

8. Passengers must complete an "Exit/Entry Health Declaration Form" and present a QR code before departure. The form can be obtained at <http://health.customsapp.com/>.
9. Nationals of China (People's Rep.) must have a green QR code with an 'HS' mark. The code can be obtained from the WeChat App 'Fang Yi Jian Kang Ma Guo Ji Ban'. More details on the specific requirements can be found on the website of the respective Chinese embassy. Passengers not arriving directly in China (People's Rep.) must obtain a new green QR code with an 'HS' mark in each transit country.
 - This does not apply to nationals of China (People's Rep.) arriving from Chinese Taipei, Hong Kong SAR, China, Macao SAR, China.
10. Passengers must have a green QR code with an 'HDC' mark. The code can be obtained at <https://hrhk.cs.mfa.gov.cn/H5/>. More details on the specific requirements can be found on the website of the respective Chinese embassy. Passengers not arriving directly in China (People's Rep.) must obtain a new green QR code with an 'HDC' mark in each transit country.
 - This does not apply to:
 - nationals of China (People's Rep.);
 - passengers arriving from Chinese Taipei, Hong Kong SAR, China, Macao SAR, China.
11. Passengers arriving from Chinese Taipei must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) PCR test result issued at most 3 days before departure.
12. Passengers entering Beijing (PEK) from Hong Kong SAR, China must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) PCR test result issued at most 7 days before departure.
13. Passengers arriving from Macao SAR, China must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) PCR test result issued at most 7 days before departure.

EGYPT - published 14.04.2022

Passengers entering or transiting through Egypt must have:

- a printed negative COVID-19 PCR or rapid antigen test taken at most 72 hours before arrival. The test must be based on a nasal or oral swab. The test result must have a stamp of the issuing laboratory or a QR code. A COVID-19 RT-PCR test used to depart Egypt becomes invalid for re-entry in all cases; or
- a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V at least 14 days before departure. The certificate must be in Arabic, French or English and have a QR code; or
- a COVID-19 vaccination certificate approved and certified by the Egyptian Embassy in the country of departure showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V at least 14 days before departure.
- This does not apply to passengers younger than 12 years.

FRANCE - published 01.04.2022

1. Passengers must complete a Digital Passenger Locator Form found at <https://app.euplf.eu/>
 - This does not apply to passengers who have started their journey in Russian Fed. or Ukraine.
2. Passengers must have:
 - a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point; or
 - a negative COVID-19 antigen taken at most 48 hours before departure from the first embarkation point; or
 - a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that:
 - they were vaccinated with Janssen at least 28 days and at most 270 days before arrival; or
 - they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covishield, Fiocruz, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty) or R-Covi at least 7 days and at most 270 days before arrival; or
 - they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covishield, Fiocruz, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty) or R-Covi and received a booster dose of Moderna (Spikevax) or Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty); or
 - they were fully vaccinated with Covaxin, Sinopharm or Sinovac and received a dose of Moderna (Spikevax) or

Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty) at least 7 days before arrival;

- a COVID-19 recovery certificate issued at least 11 days and at most 6 months before departure from the first embarkation point if arriving from Albania, Andorra, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Aruba, Austria, Azerbaijan, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belgium, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Bolivia, Bonaire, St. Eustatius and Saba, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Canada, Cape Verde, Chad, Chile, Chinese Taipei, Colombia, Comoros, Congo, Congo (Dem. Rep.), Costa Rica, Cote d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cuba, Curacao, Cyprus, Denmark, Djibouti, Dominican Rep., Ecuador, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Estonia, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Fiji, Finland, Gabon, Gambia, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Grenada, Guatemala, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Honduras, Hong Kong (SAR China), Hungary, Iceland, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Ireland (Rep.), Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kiribati, Korea (Rep.), Kosovo (Rep.), Kuwait, Lao People's Dem. - This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 12 years;

- passengers younger than 18 years traveling with a fully vaccinated adult.

- This does not apply to passengers who have started their journey in Russian Fed. or Ukraine.

3. Passengers entering or transiting through France from a country other than Albania, Andorra, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Aruba, Austria, Azerbaijan, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belgium, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Bolivia, Bonaire, St. Eustatius and Saba, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Canada, Cape Verde, Chad, Chile, Chinese Taipei, Colombia, Comoros, Congo, Congo (Dem. - This does not apply to passengers younger than 12 years.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers who have started their journey in Russian Fed. or Ukraine;
- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that:
 - they were vaccinated with Janssen at least 28 days and at most 270 days before arrival; or
 - they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covishield, Fiocruz, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty) or R-Covi at least 7 days and at most 270 days before arrival; or
 - they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covishield, Fiocruz, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty) or R-Covi and received a booster dose of Moderna (Spikevax) or Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty); or
 - they were fully vaccinated with Covaxin, Sinopharm or Sinovac and received a dose of Moderna (Spikevax) or Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty) at least 7 days before arrival;
- passengers younger than 12 years;
- passengers younger than 18 years traveling with a fully vaccinated adult.

5. Passengers could be subject to a COVID-19 test upon arrival.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers arriving from Albania, Andorra, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Aruba, Austria, Azerbaijan, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belgium, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Bolivia, Bonaire, St. Eustatius and Saba, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Canada, Cape Verde, Chad, Chile, Chinese Taipei, Colombia, Comoros, Congo, Congo (Dem. - passengers with a visa issued by the Philippines (excluding 9(a) visas);

- former nationals of the Philippines (Balikbayans) and their accompanying spouses and children.

6. Visa exemptions have been reinstated.

7. Suspension of all visa on arrival facilities.

Immunity Status:

- **Immune-Vaccinated:** Anyone who received any of the following COVID-19 vaccine approved/recognized by the Ministry of Public Health within its immunity validity period:

- o Valid for nine (9) months from fourteen (14) days after 2nd dose vaccination of Pfizer, Moderna, Astra Zenica COVID-19 vaccines.

- o Valid for twelve (12) months after the booster dose vaccination of Pfizer, Moderna, Astra Zenica COVID-19 vaccines.

- o Valid for nine (9) months from 2 weeks after the 1st dose of Jansen & Jansen COVID-19 vaccine.

- o Valid for twelve (12) months from seven (7) days of receiving the booster dose of Jansen & Jansen COVID-19 vaccine.

- o Valid for six (6) months from fourteen (14) days after the 2nd dose or booster dose of conditionally approved COVID-19 vaccines, where a *positive* Serology on Antibody Test lab result is required and is valid for 30 days from testing; If the traveler is unable to take a Serology Antibody test in the country of origin or if the Antibody

test result appear negative, the traveler must undergo relevant quarantine for 5 days; Those who received booster dose using MOPH approved vaccines immune status is extended to twelve (12) months from fourteen (14) days after the booster dose and Serology Antibody test is no longer required.

- **Immune-Recovered:** Anyone who had a medically confirmed COVID-19 infection acquired either locally or overseas is considered to have immune status valid for twelve (12) months from the date of the infection. There should be an official and verifiable laboratory test result as evidence of the past infection.
- **Unvaccinated / Non-immune:** Anyone who does not meet any of the above criteria.

Travelers who are vaccinated outside Qatar are required to submit the original vaccine certificate and any other supporting documents –in Arabic or English language– as a proof that they have obtained the vaccine and should at least include the following information:

- o The name of the traveler must be identical to that on the passport.
- o Doses and dates of vaccine given (one dose for Jansen vaccine and two doses for other vaccines).
- o Type/name of vaccine.
- o The serial number of the vaccine batch and QR code (if available).

General policy:

1. Based on COVID-19 epidemiology in different countries and their local health risk indicators, Qatar has developed specific health and safety measures for travelers coming to Qatar – *Standard Health Measures and Red Health Measures*.
2. Citizens and residents are free to travel abroad at any time provided that the Travel and Return Policy is adhered to when returning to Qatar.
3. The Ministry of Public Health advises citizens and residents to look up and comply with COVID-19 health measures currently in place in the destination country.
4. Travelers are responsible for keeping up to date with changes to the Travel and Return Policy through official sources before planning to travel to Qatar.
5. Travelers must comply with Qatar's COVID-19 procedures at all time to reduce the spread of COVID-19.
6. Travelers who are required to have a PCR lab result before traveling to Qatar must have it at a medical center authorized by the health authorities in the country of departure. A negative test result is required and must be obtained no more than 48 hours before the time of departure from the country of origin. (Please see the pre-travel test rules for detailed guidance.)

7. Unvaccinated children **below the age of 12 years** travelling with immune or recovered parent/s will follow the same rules that apply to their parent/s and are not required to have a pre-travel PCR test but only post-arrival test (Rapid Antigen Test) at the following locations:

- a. Citizens and Residents: at any public/private clinic within 24 hours of arrival in Qatar and parent/s must sign an Undertaking form.
- b. GCC Citizens (non-resident) and Visitors: if parent/s are exempted from quarantine, testing for children will be at the port of entry (airport, land, sea) upon arrival in Qatar; if parent/s are subject to hotel quarantine, testing will be at the quarantine hotel.

8. Documentary requirements for non-residents of Qatar:

- a) For GCC nationals and GCC residents who meets the immunity criteria, the following COVID health app used in any of the GCC countries shall be honored and accepted in Qatar in lieu of online pre-travel registration on condition that it reflects Immune status:

- b) COVPass health app for EU nationals and EU residents shall be honored and accepted in Qatar in lieu of online registration on condition that they meet the immunity criteria and reflected in the COVPass app.

10. Travelers who hold any of the above health apps shall be exempted from online registration and are required to proceed to any authorized private clinics for Rapid Antigen Test within 24 hours of their arrival in Qatar. Pre-travel RT-PCR test is required for immune and non-immune travelers coming from the countries under Red Health Measures. Meanwhile, non-immune travelers must register on the pre-travel registration platform and submit their pre-travel PCR test.

11. Travelers of the above two categories are reminded that it is mandatory to download and activate Qatar's Ehteraz mobile health app as soon as they arrive.

- c) Non-residents of Qatar who are non-immune/unvaccinated OR who does not fall in the above 2 categories must register via the pre-travel registration system for people entering the State of Qatar on www.ehteraz.gov.qa website and upload all relevant official documents, where applicable, such as vaccination certificates, evidence of previous COVID-19 infection, serology antibody test results (for conditional vaccines), and PCR lab result at least 3 days before arrival. Although uploading the PCR test result is not mandatory during the electronic pre-registration process, travelers who are required to have pre-travel PCR test, must present the original copy of the PCR test result to the airlines in order to allow them to board the plane, or at the country's ports (land and sea). Your pre-travel online

registration will help accelerate your passage and clearance at the port of arrival for a better arrival experience in Qatar.

12. While pre-travel registration remains optional for citizens and residents of Qatar, the Ministry of Public Health recommends that all individuals entering Qatar pre-register to ensure the best experience upon arrival particularly those traveling with unvaccinated family members who are required to complete home quarantine as they are required to sign an Undertaking which is readily available in the Ehteraz online registration.
13. The Ministry of Public Health has the right to conduct random COVID-19 testing (Rapid Antigen Test or PCR) of travelers upon arrival in Qatar through its air, land and sea ports.
14. Travelers must download the Ehteraz mobile application and activate it on their mobile phones using a local or international SIM card.
15. All passengers must sign an Undertaking and **Acknowledgement Form** before arriving in Qatar. The form is available on the Ministry of Public Health website, pre-registration platform website www.ehteraz.gov.qa and airline online booking form. Citizens and residents are exempted from this requirement on the condition that they are fully vaccinated inside the State of Qatar arriving from one of the countries to which Standard Health Measure apply.
16. Self-testing of Rapid Antigen is not applicable to travelers. Post-travel/upon arrival Rapid Antigen Testing must be conducted at an authorized healthcare facility: (Please see our post-travel testing policy for detailed instructions) as follows:
 - a. Citizens and Residents: at any public (PHCC) or Private clinic.
 - b. GCC Citizens (non-resident) and Visitors: anyone subject to home quarantine with first-degree relatives shall have their testing done at any authorized private clinics; for unvaccinated children below 12 yrs old who are accompanied by parent/s exempted from quarantine, testing will be at the port of entry (airport, land, sea).
 - c. Travelers who are subject to hotel quarantine will have their testing done at the hotel.
17. Travelers who are required to complete quarantine in a hotel quarantine facility must book a Welcome-Home quarantine package through Discover Qatar's website <https://www.discoverqatar.qa/welcome-home/>.
18. In the case of home quarantine, accommodation conditions must be appropriate, and if the property does not comply with the conditions mentioned in the undertaking, the traveler must book the hotel quarantine package through Discover Qatar's website before travelling to Qatar.
19. Travelers arriving in Qatar should go to the COVID-19 test clinic at the entry port in case of any COVID-19-related symptoms and take the necessary isolation measures.
20. Travelers should not go to work or mix with others until the Rapid Antigen Test result is out.
21. For unvaccinated travelers, their health status in the Ehteraz app will be Yellow because they are under quarantine (please review the quarantine policy for detailed instructions).
22. Travelers should, on regular basis, check the MoPH Travel and Return Policy for up-to-date detailed guidance according to the country classification and health and safety measures.
23. Mekhaines quarantine period shall remain at 7 days for non-immune/unvaccinated.

Ehteraz Mobile Application Policy:

- Passengers arriving in Qatar must download and activate the Ehteraz app on their mobile devices upon arrival at Qatar's entry ports. To do so, the traveler must have the following:
 1. SIM card from one of Qatar's service providers (Ooredoo or Vodafone) or an international SIM card.
 2. Mobile internet connection.
 3. The smartphone should support Android 6, newer versions or IOS 13.5 and later versions.
 4. Download and install the app on the mobile phone either via Google Play, Apple App Store or from any online search engines.
 5. SIM cards and smartphones are available for purchase at Hamad International Airport and Abu Samra border crossing if the passenger does not own them before arrival.
- Diplomats, administrative card holders and VIP visitors arriving on official state visits are excluded from this measure.
- The Health Status on the Ehteraz app will remain yellow throughout the quarantine period, until the result of the COVID-19 test comes out negative in accordance with the above quarantine policy.
- The Health Status on the Ehteraz mobile app for fully vaccinated persons in Qatar will remain green with a golden frame to indicate that they are excluded from quarantine if the result of the PCR test is negative and that they have completed 14 days from the date of the prescribed doses of the vaccine.
- The Health Status for citizens and residents who have received the vaccine outside Qatar will remain green without a golden frame until their vaccine data is updated in the system.
- The Health Status on the Ehteraz app for visitors who have received the vaccine outside Qatar will remain green without a golden frame until their vaccine data is updated in the system.

2. Passengers entering or transiting the Russian Fed. must have a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken at most 2 days before arrival. The test result must be in English or Russian. A notarized translation to Russian is accepted.

- passengers arriving from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Moldova (Rep.), Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan.

3. Passengers arriving from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Moldova (Rep.), Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan must have a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken at most 2 days before arrival. The test result must have a green QR code obtained in the app 'Traveling without COVID-19'.

- This does not apply to nationals of the Russian Fed.

5. Suspension of e-visa issuance.

SAUDI ARABIA - published 28.03.2022

1. The following passengers are allowed to enter.

- nationals and residents of Saudi Arabia;
- first degree family members of nationals of Saudi Arabia;
- nationals of Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar and United Arab Emirates;
- passengers with an exit/entry, residence, tourist, visit or work visa issued by Saudi Arabia;
- passengers who can obtain a visa on arrival;

- domestic workers of nationals of Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and United Arab Emirates. They must be accompanied by the sponsor;
 - Umrah passengers.
- 2. Passengers who in the past 14 days have been in Iran, Lebanon or Turkey are not allowed to enter.**
- This does not apply to nationals and residents of Saudi Arabia with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate issued in Saudi Arabia.**
- 3. Passengers must download and register on the TAWAKKALNA app before departure or on arrival.**
4. Passengers with a visit visa must have medical insurance to cover COVID-19 expenses.
5. Airlines can check the validity of the exit/entry visas for residents of Saudi Arabia at <https://mugeem.sa/#/visa-validity/check>

SRI LANKA - published 23.04.2022

Traveling to Sri Lanka

- Effective 1st March 2022, FULLY Vaccinated passengers do not require PCR or Antigen tests to enter Sri Lanka.

Recommended doses of each Country varies, therefore, please follow below as appropriate to consider passengers as FULLY VACINATED and travel after 2 weeks of vaccination

A traveler with 2 dose vaccine or a recommended combination, consider him/her as FULLY VACINATED

A traveler with recommended one dose vaccine (eg ;Janssen Vaccine) he/she is considered FULLY VACINATED

Children 18 years and below, with recommended one dose is also considered as FULLY VACINATED and can travel after 2 weeks .Travel should be after 2 weeks after the vaccination and 7 days after .

TRAVELLERS WITH PAST HISOTORY OF COVID-19 INFECTION

Should Travel after 7 days and should have at least

1 dose of vaccination

Travel as mentioned after 7 days after a PCR/RAT positive Report

Must Carry the diagnosis card for verifiable details of Covid-19 in ENGLISH

Travelers should carry proof of vaccination in English

- On arrival ETA has been activated at BIA only for fully vaccinated Tourists.
- Tourists may obtain Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) using web protocol (<https://www.srilanka.travel/helloagain/>)
- Airlines can carry any number of unvaccinated passengers per aircraft in to Sri Lanka.
- Maximum transit time of 12 hours restriction removed.
- Health declaration form -NOT REQUIRED
- Travelers with confirm onward connection maximum transit time at BIA is limited to 16 hours.
- Children 12-18 years, if depart two weeks after obtaining at least a single dose of Pfizer- vaccine will be considered as fully vaccinated.

Fully Vaccinated Travellers

- Release from airport, no quarantine required
- Vaccinate certificate must be in English or translated to English

Unvaccinated children of fully vaccinated parents

Children of tourist/ foreign national parents

- 12 – 18 Years old children PCR on day 1 at Ministry of health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine Hotel/ Level 1 Hotel
- If results negative release with parents, no further quarantine

Children of Sri Lankan /Dual Citizens / Resident visa holder parents

- 12-18 years old children PCR on day 1 at Ministry of Health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine center (Sri Lankans & Dual Citizens) / Quarantine hotel /Level 1 Hotel
- Unvaccinated children below 12 years whose parents are Fully Vaccinated shall be released with their parents for Home Quarantine.
- If results negative release with parents, no further quarantine

Travelers not vaccinated/ not completed the recommended doses of vaccination

Tourist/ Foreign national

- Negative Day one PCR for age 12 years and above done at Ministry of health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine Hotel/ Level 1 Hotel
- Quarantine for 7 days at quarantine hotel/ Level 1 hotel
- Negative PCR / Rapid antigen test on day 7
- Release from quarantine center on day 7 if results negative

Sri Lankan/ Dual Citizens / Resident visa Holders

- Negative Day one PCR for age 12 years and above done at Ministry of health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine center (Sri Lankans, Dual citizens) / Quarantine hotel/ Level 1 Hotel
- Quarantine for 7 days at quarantine hotel/ center (Sri Lankans & Dual citizens) Level 1 hotel or quarantine for 7 days at home.
- Negative PCR / Rapid antigen test on day 7

- Release from quarantine on day 7 if results are negative.

Travelers depart within less than 14 days of completion of recommended doses of vaccination

Tourist/ Foreign national

- Negative day 1 PCR for age 12 years and above done at Ministry of health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine Hotel/ Level 1 Hotel.
- Quarantine until completion of 14 days post vaccination or 7 days after arrival at quarantine hotel/ level 1 hotel or whatever the complete first.
- Negative PCR/ Rapid antigen test for aged 12 years and above (on completion of 14 days post vaccination of parents / 7 days after arrival), Release from quarantine.

Sri Lankan/ Dual Citizens / Resident visa Holders

- Negative Day one PCR for age 12 years and above done at Ministry of health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine center (Sri Lankans, Dual citizens) / Quarantine hotel/ Level 1 Hotel.
- Quarantine until completion of 14 days post vaccination/ 7 days after arrival at quarantine hotel/Quarantine center (Sri Lankans & dual citizens)/ level 1 hotel.
- Or quarantine until completion of 14 days post vaccination / 7 days after arrival at home and their children.
- Negative PCR/ Rapid antigen test for aged 12 years and above (on completion of 14 days post vaccination of parents / 7 days after arrival), Release from quarantine

Travelers with history of COVID-19 (PCR indicates as Positive) , within last six months arriving / with a single dose of vaccination as mentioned

- Negative Rapid Antigen report taken 48 Hrs prior to embarkation
- Passenger must carry diagnosis card / Initial COVID –19 detected report.
- Vaccine certificate
- Released from airport, no quarantine

Unvaccinated children below 18 years of these parents

Children of tourist/ foreign national parents

- 12 – 18 Years old children PCR on day 1 at Ministry of health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine Hotel/ Level 1 Hotel

- If results negative release with parents, no further quarantine

Children of Sri Lankan /Dual Citizens / Resident visa holder parents

- 12-18 years old children PCR on day 1 at Ministry of Health approved lab at Katunayake or Quarantine center (Sri Lankans & Dual Citizens) / Quarantine hotel /Level 1 Hotel
- If results negative release with parents, no further quarantine

Seafarers or Maritime Security officers

Foreign national

- No prior approval needed.
- Not Vaccinated
 - Should be quarantine in an isolation center
- Vaccinated -
 - Hold PCR done within 72hrs prior embarkation released from quarantine
 - If COVID 19 PCR excepted category should perform day 1 PCR at airport and released with negative results no need to undergo further quarantine
 - Seafarers/Marshals with a history of COVID-19 disease within the preceding 03 months may arrive with a negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test done within 48hrs prior to departure.
 - If the above mentioned Tests are Negative, they will be released without quarantine.

Sri Lankan national

- Vaccinated -
 - Hold PCR done within 72hrs prior embarkation released from quarantine
 - Seafarers/Marshals with a history of COVID-19 disease within the preceding 03 months may arrive with a negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test done within 48hrs prior to departure.
 - If COVID 19 PCR excepted category should perform day 1 PCR at airport and released with negative results no need to undergo further quarantine.
 - If the above-mentioned Tests are Negative, they will be released without quarantine.
- Not Vaccinated-
 - Day 1 PCR with negative result can undergo home quarantine
- Day one PCR on arrival

- Fully Vaccinated (recommended doses of the covid-19 vaccination are completed and departs after 14 days completion of vaccination / should carry original vaccination card in English language) and negative results

- No further quarantine

- Inform MOH

Foreign national staff members of diplomatic mission or UN organizations/ UN specialized organizations/ UN specialized agencies/ International organizations with permanent office in Sri Lanka (Mentioned in Annex 1) who are holding diplomatic /UN / Official passport

- Staff members and accompanying spouse, parents, children are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at a quarantine hotel/ safe & secure certified level 1 hotel / quarantine at a medical health officer approved residence.
- Prior approval needed from area MOH for the resident suitability to mandatory quarantine
- Details must be informed to area MOH on day 1 of arrival.

Airline Crew

General Measures & Procedures (Mandatory to All Crew)

- All Crew who have been vaccinated must carry Original Vaccination Certificate/Card in English. If the Certificate/Card is not in English, a certified English translation must be in possession;
- Crew Members if in Quarantine are to adhere to the public health measures of the Ministry of Health protocols in force at the time;
- Airlines to take measures to monitor and supervise the adherence of crew with regards to
- COVID19 preventive measures;
- Airline crew who has been in immediate close contact with a COVID19 patient shall not be enrolled for duty;
- Airline Crew must submit a completed Health Declaration Form upon Arrival to the Health Counters at the Airport.

Foreign Airline Crew (Operating into Sri Lanka with a Foreign Carrier)

Foreign airline crew members shall adhere to the following guidelines in addition to General Measures.

- It is mandatory for the Foreign Airline Crew Members arriving into Sri Lanka to carry a Negative COVID-19 test result in English language done within 72 hours prior to departure.
- Airlines are permitted to select any hotel of their choice for crew that are fully vaccinated and 14 days have lapsed since the last dose.

- If crew layover for less than 72hrs, and the Unvaccinated Crew are confined to the Hotel Premises, the crew then do not require a PCR Test on arrival (Day 01)
- If layover is 72 hours or more in Sri Lanka, on arrival (Day One) PCR test shall be done and the Unvaccinated Crew Members shall be quarantined at the Hotel until they depart from Sri Lanka.
- After sample collection, for any operational reason the crew member can be released for a return flight without the result of the test

Foreign Airline Crew who have been Fully Vaccinated (Final dose of Vaccine + 14 Days).

- It is mandatory for the foreign airline crew members arriving into Sri Lanka to carry a negative COVID-19 test result in English language done within 72 hours prior to departure;
- If the above-mentioned Test is Negative, they will be released without Day 01/ Arrival PCR Test and quarantine.
- If the Crew Member is staying for longer than 7 days, a PCR test is to be conducted on Day 07.

SWITZERLAND --- published 02.05.2022
 COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 1 May 2022.

TANZANIA - published 03.05.2022

1. Passengers and airline crew must complete the "Traveler's Surveillance Form" for Tanzania at <https://afyamsafiri.moh.go.tz/> and for Zanzibar at <https://healthtravelnz.mohz.go.tz> at most 24 hours before arrival. Effective 01st May the system is under maintenance and travellers are allowed to travel without completion of the online health form
2. Passengers must have:
 - a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival. Vaccines accepted are: AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm and Sinovac; or
 - a negative COVID-19 NAAT or RT-PCR test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point. The test certificate must have a QR code.
 - This does not apply to:
 - passengers younger than 5 years;
 - passengers with a COVID-19 recovery certificate issued at least 10 days and at most 180 before arrival.
3. Passengers arriving from Congo (Dem. Rep.), Egypt, France, India, Malawi, Rwanda, South Africa, USA, Uganda and United Kingdom are subject to a COVID-19 rapid antigen test upon arrival at their own expense. The test can be paid before departure at <https://zanzibarcovidtesting.co.tz/app/home> .
 - This does not apply to passengers who are 5 years or younger.
4. Passengers traveling to Zanzibar (ZNZ) from United Arab Emirates are subject to a COVID-19 test upon arrival.
 - This does not apply to passengers younger than 6 years.

THAILAND - published 02.05.2022

Aged Below 12:-

- Can travel alone if fully vaccinated at least 14 days before travel
- If not fully vaccinated , must travel with parents

Aged 12-17:-

- Can travel alone if vaccinated with at least 01 dose of COVID-19 vaccine at least 14days before travel
- If unvaccinated , must travel with parents

Aged 18 and above:-

- Must be fully vaccinated at least 14days before travel.

Remarks:-

- Persons of all age groups who are fully vaccinated can travel to Thailand alone
- Persons who are vaccinated with at least 1 dose of COVID-19 vaccine after their recovery from COVID-19 infection (must have a medical certificate certifying their recovery) are considered as fully vaccinated.

1. Until 31 May 2022, passengers and airline crew are not allowed to enter and transit.

- This does not apply to:

- nationals and residents of Thailand;
- passengers who are spouses, parents or children of a national of Thailand;
- airline crew with a return scheduled flight;
- passengers who are visa exempt;
- passengers with a visa issued by Thailand;
- nationals of Australia, China (People's Rep.), Japan, Korea (Rep.), Malaysia, New Zealand, Singapore and Viet Nam with an APEC Business Travel Card arriving from the country that issued the APEC Business Travel Card;
- passengers with a Chinese Taipei (on the cover: Republic of China Taiwan) passport with an APEC Business Travel Card arriving from the country that issued the APEC Business Travel Card;
- residents of Hong Kong (SAR China) with an APEC Business Travel Card arriving from Hong Kong (SAR China);
- students;
- passengers transiting through Bangkok (BKK);
- passengers traveling to Bangkok (BKK), Phuket (HKT) or Ko Samui (USM).

2. Passengers must have a Thailand Pass QR code obtained at <https://tp.consular.go.th>

3. Passengers entering Thailand must have a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V at least 14 days before departure. If traveling under the Sandbox Program scheme, Medigen (MVC-COV1901) and Sputnik Light are also accepted.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers traveling under the Alternative Quarantine (AQ) scheme;
- passengers younger than 12 years;
- passengers younger than 18 years traveling with their fully-vaccinated parents/guardians;
- passengers between 12 and 17 years with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they received one dose of AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V. If traveling under the Sandbox Program scheme, Medigen (MVC-COV1901) and Sputnik Light are also accepted.
- passengers with a recovery certificate and a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they received at least one dose of AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V at least 14 days before departure. If traveling under the Sandbox Program scheme, Medigen (MVC-COV1901) and Sputnik Light are also accepted.

4. Passengers entering or transiting through Thailand must have medical insurance with minimum coverage of USD 20,000.

- This does not apply to nationals of Thailand.

5. Passengers traveling under the Test & Go scheme must have a hotel reservation for 1 night at AQ, OQ or SHA+ hotel and 2 COVID-19 tests (one RT-PCR test on day 1 and one antigen test on day 5) obtained at www.thailandsha.com or <https://asq.in.th>.
6. Passengers traveling under the Sandbox Program scheme must:
 - arrive at Bangkok (BKK), Phuket (HKT) or Ko Samui (USM); and
 - have a hotel reservation for 5 nights at SHA+ hotel obtained at www.thailandsha.com and proof of payment for COVID-19 tests (one RT-PCR test on day 1 and one antigen test on day 5). They are subject to quarantine for 5 days.
7. Passengers traveling under the Alternative Quarantine (AQ) scheme must have proof of payment for COVID-19 tests; and
 - a hotel reservation at AQ, OQ or AHQ hotel obtained at www.thailandsha.com and <https://asq.in.th> for 5 nights.
8. Passengers transiting through Thailand must have health insurance to cover COVID-19 expenses (minimum coverage of USD 20,000).
9. Airline crew are subject to self-isolation until their next flight.
10. Airline crew staying overnight must have a guarantee letter from the airline or health insurance to cover COVID-19 expenses (minimum coverage of USD 20,000).

From 1 May 2022, travelers entering Thailand will be subject to new entry measures, as follows;

1. Fully Vaccinated Passengers must :

- Passengers must have a Thailand Pass QR code obtained at <https://tp.consular.go.th>
- Proof of Insurance with at least USD 10,000 coverage for medical treatments in Thailand (for non-Thai only)
(COVID19 test, both prior to and after arriving in Thailand, is no longer required)

2. Unvaccinated Passengers :

(Option 1 – Exemption from quarantine) Travelers with a negative RT-PCR test result issued within 72 hours before travelling must :

- Register on Thailand Pass and must have QR code obtained at <https://tp.consular.go.th>
- Proof of Insurance with at least USD 10,000 coverage for medical treatments in Thailand (for non-Thai only)

(Option 2 – Quarantine) Travelers who cannot undergo an RT-PCR test result within 72 hours before travelling or wish to be quarantined must :

- Register on Thailand Pass and must have QR code obtained at <https://tp.consular.go.th>
- Proof of Insurance with at least USD 10,000 coverage for medical treatments in Thailand (for non-Thai only)
- Undergo an RT-PCR test on Day 4 -5 in Thailand during the mandatory 5-day quarantine at AQ hotel.
(a hotel reservation at AQ hotel obtained at www.thailandsha.com and <https://asq.in.th>)

3. Passengers entering or transiting through Thailand must have medical insurance with minimum coverage of USD 10,000

- The connecting flight must be booked on the same ticket and baggage checked through final destination.
- Domestic connecting flights are permitted.

Note – Travelers whose Thailand Pass have already been issued can travel with the issued QR Code and do not need to register for new Thailand Pass. (All Travelers must have individual QR Code)

Applicants can use their approved Thailand Pas QR Code to enter Thailand on different date if the new date of arrival is within 7 days before or after the original date as indicated on the QR Code (no need to re-apply or modify your application).

Please note that passengers are required to show proof of revised hotel accommodation that corresponds to the new dates, and non-Thai are also required to show proof of insurance for medical treatments in Thailand for the entire duration of their revised travel itinerary.

Failure to produce these documents may result in denied boarding. Further note that each Thailand Pass QR Code can be used only once.

Only valid Thailand Pass is required for check-in (Visa if any)

Layover Crew:

- The new entry protocol is applied for passenger only. Individual Crew must apply Thailand Pass if would like to leave hotel by attach required documents, hotel/accommodation address, company's insurance(letter) and crew ID.
- In case crew members applied and hold valid Thailand Pass, they must present their passport (applied for Thailand Pass), together with Gendec (with PIC signature in Gendec) to submit to Port Health Office at D7.
- The Health Office will verify Thailand Pass against Passport, Vaccine Certificate and Health Insurance. In additional to that they will stamp on Gendec as well. After that ground staff and airline representative needs to escort crew for immigration formality.
- Crew without Thailand pass is required to follow the same existing protocol (room lockdown).

TURKEY - published 10.03.2022

1. Passengers must have:

- a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken at most 72 hours before arrival; or
- a negative COVID-19 antigen test taken at most 48 hours before arrival; or
- a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival; or
- a COVID-19 recovery certificate issued at least 28 days and at most 6 months before arrival.
- This does not apply to:
 - passengers younger than 12 years;
 - merchant seamen.

2. Passengers could be subject to self-isolation for up to 14 days.

- This does not apply to passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival.

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES - published 21.03.2022

1. Passengers are not allowed to enter.

- This does not apply to:
 - nationals and residents of United Arab Emirates;
 - domestic workers who are traveling with the sponsor or with the first degree family members of the sponsor;
 - passengers with an entry permit issued by United Arab Emirates;
 - passengers traveling as tourists to Abu Dhabi (AUH), Dubai (DXB), Ras-al-Khaima (RKT) or Sharjah (SHJ) with a return/onward ticket;
 - passengers traveling to Abu Dhabi (AUH) with a pre-arranged visa issued by Abu Dhabi;
 - nationals and residents of Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar and Saudi Arabia;
 - nationals of Korea (Rep.) traveling under the Fast Track program and traveling to Dubai (DXB). They must have a pre-arranged visa or a pre-approval to enter;
 - nationals of Andorra, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Brunei Darussalam, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, China (People's Rep.), Colombia, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia,

Denmark, El Salvador, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Honduras, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland (Rep.), Israel, Italy, Japan, Kazakhstan, Korea (Rep.), Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Maldives, Malta, Mauritius, Mexico, Monaco, Montenegro, Nauru, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Peru, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russian Fed., San Marino, Serbia, Seychelles, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, Solomon Isl., Spain, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Sweden, Switzerland, USA, Ukraine, Uruguay and Vatican City (Holy See), passengers with a British passport with nationality "British Citizen" and passengers with a Hong Kong (SAR China) passport, traveling to Abu Dhabi (AUH);

- nationals of India with a visa issued by the USA or with a residence permit issued by USA, United Kingdom or an EU Member State traveling to Abu Dhabi (AUH);
- passengers traveling to Abu Dhabi (AUH) with a resident visa;
- passengers traveling to Abu Dhabi (AUH) with a pre-arranged visa issued by any emirate;
- nationals of Indonesia traveling under the Safe Travel Corridor program. They must have an entry permit and a return ticket.

2. Passengers arriving at Dubai (DXB):

- are subject to medical screening, and
- must download and register the COVID-19 DXB Smart App before departure or upon arrival.

3. Passengers traveling as tourists arriving at Dubai (DXB) or Sharjah (SHJ) must have health insurance.

4. Residents of United Arab Emirates with a residence visa returning to Dubai (DXB) or Al Maktoum (DWC) and arriving from Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan or Sri Lanka must have a GDRFA approval obtained before departure at https://smart.gdrfad.gov.ae/Smart_OTCServicesPortal/ReturnPermitService.aspx.

- This does not apply to:

- first degree family members of nationals of United Arab Emirates and their accompanying domestic workers;
- nationals of Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar and Saudi Arabia;
- passengers with a golden residence visa issued by United Arab Emirates.

5. Passengers entering Dubai (DXB) or Al Maktoum (DWC) must have:

- a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V. The certificate must have a QR code (except the US COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card); or

- a negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 48 hours before departure of the last direct flight to United Arab Emirates. The test certificate must be in Arabic or English and must be issued by a laboratory accredited by the departure country. The test certificate must also have a QR code; or

- a COVID-19 recovery certificate with a QR code issued at most 1 month before departure.

- This does not apply to:

- nationals of United Arab Emirates and their first degree family members;
- domestic workers who are traveling with the sponsor or with the first degree family members of the sponsor;
- passengers younger than 12 years;
- passengers with disabilities.

6. Passengers entering Abu Dhabi (AUH), Fujairah (FJR), Ras Al Khaimah (RKT) or Sharjah (SHJ) from Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Botswana, Congo, Congo (Dem. Rep.), Eswatini, Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Mozambique, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Uganda, Viet Nam, Zambia or Zimbabwe must have a printed negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 48 hours before departure of the last direct flight to United Arab Emirates. The test certificate must be in Arabic or English and must be issued by a laboratory accredited by the departure country.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 16 years;
- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate with a QR code showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V;
- passengers with a COVID-19 recovery certificate with a QR code issued at most 1 month before departure;
- passengers with disabilities.

7. Passengers entering Abu Dhabi (AUH), Fujairah (FJR), Ras Al Khaimah (RKT) or Sharjah (SHJ) from a country other than Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Botswana, Congo, Congo (Dem. Rep.), Eswatini, Ethiopia, Ghana, India,

Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Mozambique, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Uganda, Viet Nam, Zambia or Zimbabwe must have a printed negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 48 hours before departure from the first embarkation point. The test certificate must be in Arabic or English and must be issued by a laboratory accredited by the departure country.

- This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 16 years;

- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate with a QR code showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V;

- passengers with a COVID-19 recovery certificate with a QR code issued at most 1 month before departure;

- passengers with disabilities.

8. A negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result issued in United Arab Emirates presented upon departure from United Arab Emirates can be accepted for re-entry into Dubai (DXB) or Al Maktoum (DWC) if it meets the specific requirements based on the departure country.

9. Passengers entering Dubai (DXB) or Al Maktoum (DWC) could be subject to a COVID-19 RT-PCR test upon arrival and quarantine until the test result is ready.

10. Passengers entering Abu Dhabi (AUH), Ras Al Khaimah (RKT) or Sharjah (SHJ) are subject to a COVID-19 PCR test upon arrival.

11. Passengers could be subject to quarantine.

- This does not apply to passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), Covaxin, Covishield, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm, Sinovac or Sputnik V.

12. Visa on arrival facilities at Abu Dhabi (AUH) restarted.

13. Expired residence permits issued by the United Arab Emirates that have been extended until December 2020 are accepted for entry. Passengers must present proof of the extended validity.

14. Nationals of Korea (Rep.) traveling under the Fast Track program must have an 'Isolation Exemption Certificate'.

15. Passengers are not allowed to transit through Abu Dhabi (AUH) for more than 24 hours. Passengers must have a confirmed airside hotel booking if their transit time exceeds 12 hours.

16. Nationals of Nigeria must have a return ticket, and a hotel booking or proof of accommodation address for the period of intended stay.

- This does not apply to passengers with a resident visa.

17. Passengers arriving at Sharjah (SHJ) must download the ALHOSN App.

18. Airline crew without a printed negative COVID-19 PCR test result of a test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point are subject to quarantine until their next flight.

19. Passengers entering Abu Dhabi (AUH) must register before departure on <https://smartservices.ica.gov.ae/echannels/web/client/guest/index.html#/registerArrivals>. This will generate a QR code which must be presented before departure and upon arrival.

- This does not apply to nationals of United Arab Emirates.

UNITED KINGDOM - published 20.03.2022

COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 17 March 2022

USA - published 19.04.2022

1. Passengers entering or transiting through the USA must have a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 15 days (day of vaccination + 14 days) before arrival. Passenger details (e.g., name and date of birth) in the certificate must match those stated in the passport/travel document. Vaccines accepted are:

- AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm (BIBP) and Sinovac. A combination of these vaccines is accepted if administered at least 17 days apart. More details can be found at

This does not apply to:

- nationals of the USA

- residents of the USA;
- passengers younger than 18;
- passengers with a letter issued by a doctor proving that the passenger is medically unable to receive the vaccine;
- passengers with the following visas: A-1, A-2, C-2, C-3 (as a foreign government official or immediate family member of an official), E-1 (as an employee of TECRO or TECO or the employee's immediate family members), G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, NATO-1 through NATO-4, or NATO-6 (or seeking to enter as a nonimmigrant in one of those NATO classifications);
- passengers with a letter of invitation or other official document, issued by the USA, by other government or by the United Nations, traveling on duty;
- nationals of Afghanistan, Algeria, Angola, Armenia, Benin, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Rep., Chad, Congo, Congo (Dem. Rep.), Cote d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Egypt, Ethiopia, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Iraq, Kenya, Kiribati, Liberia, Libya, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mozambique, Myanmar, Namibia, Nicaragua, Niger, Nigeria, Papua New Guinea, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Isl., Somalia, South Sudan, Syria, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Vanuatu, Yemen and Zambia, with a visa issued by the USA, excluding B -1 and B -2 visas;
- members of the U.S. Armed Forces, their spouses, and children younger than 18 years;
- merchant seamen with one of the following visas: C, D, C1/D, B1, H or L.

2. Passengers entering or transiting through the USA must have a negative COVID-19 test taken at most 1 day before departure from the first embarkation point. Tests accepted are: antigen, NAAT, RT-LAMP, RT-PCR or TMA.

- This does not apply to:
 - passengers younger than 2 years;
 - US military personnel;
 - passengers with documentation of recovery from COVID-19 in the form of:
 - a positive COVID-19 test taken at least 10 days and at most 90 days before departure from the first embarkation point; and
 - a letter issued by a health authority stating that the passenger has been cleared for travel;
- until 30 April 2022, nationals and residents of USA and their family members arriving from Belarus, Russian Fed. and Ukraine;
- until 11 May 2022, nationals and residents of USA and their accompanying family members arriving from Shanghai, China (People's Rep.).

 - passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 15 days (day of vaccination + 14 days) before arrival. Passenger details (e.g., name and date of birth) in the certificate must match those stated in the passport/travel document.
