Our glamping is completely off the grid, using solar panels for electricity in our communal lodge. We have waterless composting toilets in some of the domes, our septic system is a worm farm. All waste is recycled, and food waste is fed to the chickens. Our water is from a spring-fed creek. This is a normal way of living for us at home as well, and we endeavor to make as little impact on the environment as possible by choosing sustainable materials and eco-products wherever we can.

In response to increasing levels of illness in the community, Air New Zealand is reintroducing its Covid-19 flexibility policy until 31 July 2022. The policy allows customers travelling around New Zealand or overseas who are booked and ticketed to travel between 9 and 31 July 2022 to have the flexibility of holding their fare in credit or changing their flight and have their change fee waived.
